Espanola Council Not Happy With Yard Waste Depot Infractions

Espanola council is not pleased with the abuse of the new yard waste depot on Penage Road.

Illegal waste was dumped overnight within a week of the site opening last month and as a result, the site was closed overnight.

Council accepted a recommendation for Public Works to install a third camera and to reinstate the hours for 24 hours a day.

However, if there are any breaches, the hours will be restricted once again with the addition of some evening hours to accommodate the public.

Bylaw officer Richard Paquette is also presenting council with a draft dumping bylaw at the next meeting, which would impose stringent fines on anyone caught dumping, not only at the site, but anywhere in the Town of Espanola.

Ontario Appeal Of Stage One Ruling Of Robinson-Huron Treaty Annuities Underway

The Ontario Court of Appeal will begin hearing Ontario's appeal of the Stage One decision regarding the Robinson-Huron Treaty Annuities Case.

Chief Dean Sayers and Ogimaa Duke Peltier say Canada is not appealing the Stage One decision.

Sayer says the 21 First Nations of the Robinson-Huron Treaty are committed to continuing to hold Ontario accountable to their Treaty responsibilities through this appeal.

Peltier concurred adding decisions in both Stage One and Two of the trial were ruled in favour of the First Nations, asserting that both Canada and Ontario have a mandatory obligation to review the annuity amount and a responsibility in upholding the Treaty.

The Robinson Huron Treaty Chiefs are asking Ontario to stop their appeals of the Restoule Stage One and Two decisions and adhere to the augmentation clause of the Treaty.

Recipe

A friend shared this recipe with me after making it for her family; she said they all loved it. Shakshuka is a North African and Middle Eastern meal of poached eggs in a simmering tomato sauce with spices. It's easy, healthy and quick to prepare. It can be sprinkled with feta cheese or goat cheese and is traditionally served with pita bread.

Shakshuka

- 1 medium onion diced
- 1 red bell pepper seeded and diced
- 4 garlic cloves finely chopped
- 2 tsp paprika
- 1 tsp cumin
- 1/4 tsp chili powder
- 1 28-ounce can whole peeled tomatoes
- 6 large eggs
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 small bunch fresh cilantro chopped
- 1 small bunch fresh parsley chopped
- Feta or goat cheese (optional)

Heat olive oil in a large sauté pan on medium heat. Add the chopped bell pepper and onion and cook for 5 minutes or until the onion becomes translucent. Add garlic and spices and cook an additional minute. Pour the can of tomatoes and juice into the pan and break down the tomatoes using a large spoon. Season with salt and pepper and bring the sauce to a simmer. Use your large spoon to make small wells in the sauce and crack the eggs into each well. Cover the pan and cook for 5-8 minutes, or until the eggs are done to your liking. Garnish with chopped cilantro and parsley. Sprinkle feta or goat cheese on top if using.
