Signage, Increased Reward, Prayer Walk In Sagamok Anishnawbek First Nation



By Rosalind Russell - Support is growing for a grieving Sagamok-Anishnawbek First Nation mother who recently lost her daughter. Charlene Ann Owl's daughter, Charisse, died in November from an overdose. A mother of four children, she was only 28. Charlene announced a \$2,000 reward earlier this month for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the individual that sold the heroin, which led to her death. She says the reward is now \$3,000.

She is also meeting with Chief and Band Council on April 6th to discuss the seriousness of the opioid epidemic in the community.

Supporters are also assisting her in organizing a Prayer Walk on April 17th. Charlene says the walk will start at 10:00 a.m. in front of the residence where her daughter died and wind its way to the Catholic Church and then the ballpark where the memorial billboard will be unveiled. She adds several supporters are also posting the signs in their yards and businesses in support of her initiative to fight the epidemic that took her daughter from her.

Act Foundation Enhancing High School CPR Training With Opioid Awareness And Overdose Response Training

The Advanced Coronary Treatment Foundation says it is enhancing the ACT High School CPR and AED Program with an Opioids Overdose Response Training Module.

National Medical Director and Chair Dr. Justin Maloney says support from Health Canada's Substance Use and Addictions Program will enable the foundation to expand its Ottawa pilot of the opioids awareness and response training to hundreds of high schools across Canada. He says enhancing their program with opioids awareness and response training is a natural next step in equipping youth to respond to life threatening emergencies they may encounter.

High school teachers will be trained to teach students to recognize the signs of an opioids overdose, the importance of calling 911 quickly, and how to respond with the use of Naloxone nasal spray and perform CPR when necessary.

Huron Shores Close To Inking Deal For Wireless Internet

Municipality of Huron Shores Mayor Georges Bilodeau has been pushing for wireless Internet for the last two years as part of a community-based broadband project, which includes 31 municipalities and 12 First Nations along the North Shore corridor.

As Chair of the Huron & Manitoulin Island Community Owned Fibre Infrastructure Corporation, he is looking for supports for over 31,000 homes, businesses and institutions in the region.

He says that comes at a cost of \$150 million but half of that could come

from both the province and federal governments with municipalities covering the rest.

Biladeau adds the company is in the process of completing the application for the Universal Broadband Fund Program through the federal government.

While they wait for that decision, letters of support are being sought from educational institutions, business owners and individuals.

The decisions for federal and provincial funding are expected next month.

Recipe

Thank you to my friend for sharing a family favourite recipe. An easy but delicious, creamy, low carb dinner casserole using basic



ingredients. Prep only takes 30 minutes, so it's perfect for a weekday meal. Can also be served with naan bread or buns.

Philly Cheesesteak Casserole (Low Carb)

- 2 lb Ground beef
- 2 tsp salt

I.

- 1/2 tsp Black pepper
- 3 large Bell peppers
- (sliced into thin strips; red, yellow, and green)
- 1 large Onion (cut in half, sliced into thin slices)
- 1/2 tbsp Italian seasoning
- 1 tsp Smoked paprika
- 1/2 tsp Garlic powder
- 4 oz Cream cheese
- 1/4 cup Chicken or beef broth
- 6 slices Provolone cheese (~4 oz)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (177 degrees C). Place the beef into a large sauté pan over medium-high heat and break up with a spatula. Season with sea salt and black pepper. Cook for 8-10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until browned and cooked through. Add the bell peppers and onions to the pan. Season with Italian seasoning, smoked paprika, and garlic powder. Sauté for 10-15 minutes, until vegetables are soft. Add the cream cheese and broth. Stir together until smooth and melted. Transfer the mixture to a large stoneware baking dish (8 x 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches). Arrange provolone slices on top, overlapping slightly. Bake for 10-15 minutes, until cheese is melted.
