






Weekend Brunch Casserole

NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF ZONING BYLAW AMENDMENT

(Planning Act-Section Section 34 (18))

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers passed Bylaw 2021-45 on the 8th day of December, 2021.

File No. ZBA 21-02; Bylaw 2021-45
PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this amendment is to allow for increased building height, otherwise prohibited, for property in the Resource Recreation zone.

Property subject to this Zoning Bylaw amendment under the Planning Act is that property described as Harrow Township, Lot 11, Con 4, Parcel 9793 & 10718, at 665-A2 Lacloche Lake Road.

APPEAL - The last date for filing a notice of appeal of the by-law is January 9, 2022. Any such appeal must be filed with the clerk of the municipality and must set out the reasons for the appeal and must be accompanied by the fee required by the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal. Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a by-law to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf. No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the by-law was passed, the person of public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers or, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

These bylaws are available for inspection in the municipal office during regular office hours.

Students at Espanola High School have been keeping busy over the last few months with a special project.


Grade 10 students worked hard to make progress on a greenhouse they are building for the school.

Espanola & Area COVID Assessment Centre

The Espanola & Area COVID Assessment Centre is accepting calls from the public who are wanting to be tested for COVID-19.

Individuals wanting to be tested are to call the ERHHC Assessment Centre at 705-869-1420 ext. 4500 and leave a voice message.

Phone lines receive calls 7 days a week and your call will be followed up within 24-48 hours to book an appointment for testing (with exception to holidays).

The Assessment Centre is open for testing between Monday-Friday from 8am-4pm, with exception to holidays.

You must have an appointment to be tested!

Symptomatic Testing:

If you are experiencing <u>any</u> of the following symptoms you can call the Assessment Centre for an appointment:

- Fever and/or chills (over 37.8 degrees Celsius)
- Shortness of breath new or worsening
- Cough New or worsening
- Muscle aches
- Fatigue
- General unwellness
- Headache
- Runny nose/nasal congestion
- · Sore throat
- · Nausea, Vomiting, and/or Diarrhea
- Abdominal pain
- Loss of smell and/or taste
- Pink Eye
- If child <18 years old: decreased/lack of appetite.
- Any symptoms (even mild) and contact with a COVID-19 positive person

Asymptomatic Testing:

- People who are asymptomatic, but have had contact with a COVID-19 positive person.
- People who have been directed by Public health for testing.
- People who have a test ordered by their doctor or specialist for an appointment, operation, or procedure.
- People who have received a COVID-19 exposure alert on the App.

If you are having difficulty breathing or experiencing other severe symptoms, please call 911 immediately.

Advise them of your symptoms, contact, and travel history.
