#### **Hughes Responds to Local Challenges**

Algoma-Manitoulin-Kapuskasing MP Carol Hughes says she has made a thorough review of the Throne Speech and believes it will fail families.

She says with the cost of essentials like housing, food, and fuel expected to continue to increase in the coming months, Canadian families looking for help in today's fiscal update will find themselves disappointed.

Hughes notes that there was little to address the stresses to household budgets.

She says the companies that are making money hand over fist are profiting as inflation runs unabated.

Hughes points out that this is exactly the case with rising food cost which are fueling giant grocery chain profits, and that is simply wrong.

#### French Catholic School Board Helps Greater Sudbury Charities

If your child is starting school for the very first time, please



complete the Elementary Registration Form here: https://www.rainbowschools.ca/register-now/registration/ Completed forms can be emailed directly to schools or sent to info@rainbowschools.ca.

For enrolment in kindergarten, your child must be four years of age by the end of the calendar year.

Registration is not complete until school staff receive your child's identification documents, including birth certificate or birth registry/baptismal certificate, proof of residency, Ontario Health Card and an immunization record.

Parents/guardians can enroll their children in the English Program or the French Immersion Program.

The English Program is exclusively in English and includes a Core French component, which begins in Grade 4. Students learn French through songs, games, drama and interactive activities for a specified period daily.

French Immersion immerses children in the French language, including cultural experiences, when they begin school. English language instruction is introduced in Grade 3 and gradually builds to a balance of French and English instruction by Grade 5. This ensures that students gain effective bilingual skills. This program is designed for English speaking parents/ guardians so they may support their children to become bilingual.with permission.

#### Recipe

I hope everyone had a wonderful Christmas and I wish everyone all the best in the New Year. If you are planning on



celebrating New Year's Eve at home I have a delicious punch for you. It can be made ahead and frozen in two containers because it makes enough for two punch bowls. It is great for both children and adults. Vodka can be added to the adults punch bowl if you chose.

#### **Lucious Slush Punch**

- 2 ½ cups of white sugar
- 6 cups of water
- 2 (3 oz) packages of strawberry Jell-o
- 1 (46 oz) can of pineapple juice
- 2/3 cup of lemon juice
- 5 cups of orange juice
- 2 (2 litre) bottles of Sprite

In a large saucepan, combine sugar, water and strawberry Jell-o. Boil for 3 minutes. Stir in the pineapple juice, lemon juice, and orange juice. Divide the mixture in half, and freeze in 2 separate containers. When ready to serve, place the frozen contents of one container in a punch bowl, and stir in 1 bottle of Sprite until it is slushy.
