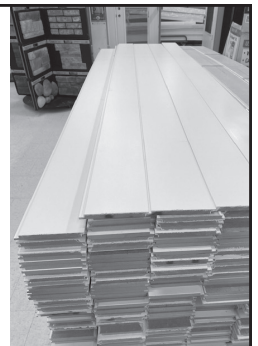

He says “hopefully, this will be the beginning of relaxing the visitor restrictions and we will be able to get out and visit again.”

Espanola’s first resident to receive the vaccine is Dave Van Allen, who was also honoured.

“A mass resident vaccination plan has been implemented and we were ready to get this vaccine into arms,” says Director of Care, Paula Mitroff

On-site to oversee the plan was Kate Denomme Public Health RN, Paula Mitroff, Director of Care, Bonnie MacKinnon, Assistant Director of Care, Dr. B. McMullen, LTC Medical Director and several other

support staff. Dr. McMullen stayed on-site to monitor the residents for any adverse reactions.

The entire process took approximately 3 hours and the 55 residents were excited and grateful for the vaccine.

“I think it’s a good idea and I hope it helps! We’ve been waiting a long time,” said Betty Fogal, Espanola Nursing Home resident.

The risk of COVID-19 outbreaks will be decreased among those who are at the greatest risk. Community members are asked to be patient and understanding as rollout plans and timing must be flexible to coincide with the availability of vaccine supply.

Heaven’s Gate Sale Moving Forward



Conservancy treasurer, Ted Cowan, says they submitted their proposal last Tuesday for \$1.65 million and it was accepted.

The property will serve as a link between Killarney Provincial Park to the east and west to the La Cloche Ridge Conservation Reserve forming a 500 square kilometre conservation zone.

The Heaven’s Gate property also links up with a property the conservatory purchased from Vale last year in Willisville to protect the hill that once had a fire tower and is now a popular hiking site.

A group devoted to land conservation in Ontario is one step closer to acquiring a huge piece of wilderness in the Willisville and Whitefish Falls area south of Espanola.

The Escarpment Biosphere Conservancy announced it had reached a deal for the purchase of the nearly 2,000 acre property which encompasses a portion of the Heaven’s Gate hiking trail.

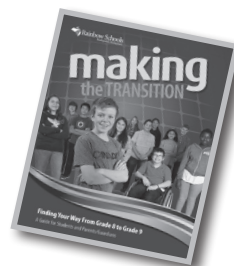

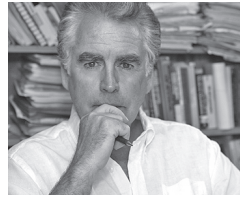

The COVID-19 vaccination — For Me, A Jab Not Well Done.

After spending the month of December running away from Christmas music, I spent January dodging the “jab.” Everybody — from England’s first senior to the first black vice-president of the United States, from the oldest person to the youngest to Dr. Fauci himself — was shown on TV getting vaccinated against COVID-19.

La Renaissance And Jeunesse-Nord Students Gain Access To Technological Learning Tool



Committed to supporting students in their learning and helping them acquire the skills required to excel in the 21st century, Conseil scolaire catholique Nouvelon completed the deployment of laptop computers in all of its secondary schools in January including École secondaire catholique Jeunesse-Nord in Blind River and École secondaire catholique La Renaissance in Espanola. As a result, all secondary school students from La Renaissance and Jeunesse-Nord now have access to a technological learning tool for the duration of their stay at CSC Nouvelon. Having access to this technological tool will allow them to further develop the basic skills and essential proficiencies that will support them in their future. The next deployment phase in support of all CSC Nouvelon elementary school students will be completed by the end of the school year. Students in grades

5 through 12 will have access to laptops while students in grades 1 through 4 will be equipped with an iPad. Just like secondary school students, grade 1 to 8 students will have access to this learning tool for the duration of their stay at CSC Nouvelon. Kindergarten students will benefit from an integrated technology center located in their classroom. "This important technological deployment will encourage the participation of all students at the CSC Nouvelon. The implementation of our innovative teaching strategies will support and enhance learning by creating inclusive collaborative experiences that will contribute to our students' academic success," explained Mr. Paul Henry, Director of Education at CSC Nouvelon.

Calling On Health Professionals To Administer Vaccines

Physicians and other primary health care professionals in the Sudbury district are being called on to sign up for providing vaccines in the fight against COVID-19. Public Health Sudbury and Districts has created a Primary Care Registry to identify health care professionals interested in meeting the

demand in providing vaccines to the public. Health professionals can sign up if they can assist at mass vaccination clinics or mobile clinics in smaller venues through the agency's website. The agency is preparing for administering the vaccine to the wider public. <https://www.phsd.ca/>

Integrity Commissioner - Two Nairn Councillors Reprimanded

Nairn & Hyman Township council has upheld the findings of the Integrity Commissioner against two councillors but has shown leniency. E4M Commissioner Peggy Young-Lovelace says Brigita Gingras had several breaches of the Code of Conduct; micro-managed the town staff, interfered with a property sale and also made a false allegation to the commissioner, which was unfounded.

GINGRAS will lose 90 days pay, undertake conflict resolution training, and apologize to the CAO and mayor in writing. The commissioner also investigated allegations against councillor Rod MacDonald of contravening the Code of Conduct, overstepping his role with staff and routinely using his position to demand services from council and/or

municipal employees for his personal benefit. Council agreed to 90 days suspended pay, removed him from all standing and ad-hoc committees and agreed to establish the committee to deal with any ongoing issues. Council will also be updating the Code of Conduct and attend training focused on conflict resolution and the legal role of council. The Integrity Reports were released in mid-December. 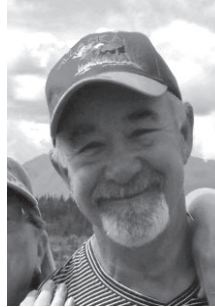

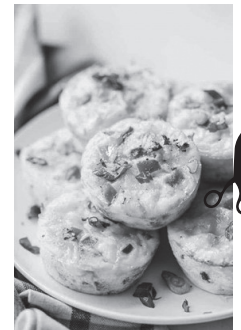
Recipe

These egg muffins are filled with peppers, onions, ham and cheese, and are a great breakfast and perfect for making ahead or on the go.

Thank you to Don for the sample and for sharing your recipe!

Denver Omelet Breakfast Muffins

- ½ cup onion chopped
- 1 cup green pepper chopped
- 1 cup chopped fully cooked ham
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 8 eggs
- ½ cup half and half cream or milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- Sliced green onion for garnish (or you can add it in.)



Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease a 12-muffin pan. Divide the onion, green pepper, and ham evenly into the muffin tins. Add the cheddar cheese evenly on the top. In a medium sized bowl whisk the eggs, half and half (or milk), salt and pepper. Pour egg mixture over the top of the cheese and fill the cup until ¾ full. Do not overfill, the egg expands when cooking and will make a mess! Bake for 20-22 minutes or until set. Remove and serve warm or let cool and store in the refrigerator or freezer. Reheat from fridge for about 30 seconds in the microwave, or frozen for about 1 minute or until heated through.

Permission to produce wholly, or in part, any part in any form whatsoever, particularly by photographic or offset process in publications must be obtained in writing. Any unauthorized reproduction will be subject to recourse in law.
