

Cambrian College Partners With Mining Manufacturer



By Rosalind Russell - Canada's largest manufacturer of underground mining vehicles is partnering with Cambrian College to support skills and technology development.

Stella Holloway of MacLean Research and Training Facility in Sudbury says it is set to host the practical component of Cambrian's Industrial Battery Electric Vehicle Maintenance Course.

She says Cambrian's curriculum, developed in part with MacLean technical input, is designed for Heavy Duty technicians currently working in the mining sector.

Cambrian-MacLean strategic skills and technology partnership will focus both on the training of heavyduty mechanics to support battery electric vehicle (BEV) fleets, as well as supporting the development of the next generation of mechatronics workers in the mining industry providing Cambrian by students with the opportunity to work directly with the MacLean Advanced Vehicle Technology (AVT) team based out of the company's Research

and Training Facility, explains Hollaway.

"Practical training for BEV mechanics and applied research opportunities for the next generation of mechatronics professionals to facilitate the adoption of on-vehicle technology — these are concrete examples of MacLean leveraging its test decline in Greater Sudbury to make a difference in the industry.

"This is a chance for us to walk-the-talk when it comes to ramping up our research and training facility to actively support long-term, positive change in mining and I'm thrilled that we're doing this in partnership with Cambrian."

"Successful innovation depends on great collaboration, and I think this partnership with MacLean is a perfect example," adds Stephen Gravel, Manager of Cambrian's Centre for Smart Mining. "No single educational institution or company can drive change entirely on its own, but rather it's a spirit of cooperation that will help us drive innovation in mining of the 21st century and that's why I'm confident we'll succeed."

La Renaissance Students Discover Ecosystems Through A Fish Farming Project



at the school, in partnership with Roland Frappier, owner of Micro Hatcheries, and with the support of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forests, sets up an elaborate fish farming project for La Renaissance students.

The goal of the project is to educate students about the importance of ecosystems. In addition, it is profitable since it integrates various science elements: chemistry with the determination of the pH system, physics with the pressures of the system in order to improve water circulation, biology with

anatomy and development of fish. The school-based fisheries project also offers students an excellent study of the functioning and importance of the ecosystem.

At the moment, ÉSC La Renaissance students are busy raising and observing some 10,000 trout eggs. They are responsible for maintaining the fish farm as well as monitoring the development of the eggs until it hatches. Afterwards, the students will ensure the transfer of fish to a suitable ecosystem in the community of Espanola. What a valuable hands-on learning initiative!



Survey Completed, Feasibility Study Being Carried Out At AB Ellis

Converting AB Ellis Public School in Espanola to senior and low-income housing is the focus of an ongoing series of studies being carried out by Rainbow Community Non-Profit Housing.

Corporation spokesperson Fred Yackman says a survey was carried out over the last couple of months to confirm to funders there is enough demand to justify converting the building and to also help designers understand individual housing needs.

He says there were 212

participants, more than the corporation had hoped for and results are being compiled and will be released next week.

The feasibility study is ongoing with Centreline Architecture.

Led by Kate Bowman the company is working on the layout and design of the building based on the initial responses from the survey.

The "as-is" assessment should be completed by the end of March and will include a final design and drawings as well as a focus on the economic market evaluation of the project.



Recipe






The whipped cream topping can be omitted if desired. It stores well in the refrigerator.

Black Forest Dessert

- 1 (18.25 ounce) package devil's food or chocolate cake mix
- 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese
- ½ cup white sugar
- 1 (21 ounce) can cherry pie filling
- Large container of Cool Whip



While cake is baking; in a medium-size mixing bowl, mix cream cheese and sugar together until blended. Place in the refrigerator.

When the cake has finished cooking, let cool completely. Carefully spread the cream cheese mixture over the cake. Next, pour the cherry pie filling over the cream cheese mixture. Frost carefully with the whipped topping and refrigerate until ready to serve.
