

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Concerning Application for Consent

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting on **Wednesday, July 28, 2021 at 6:00 p.m.** in order to consider a proposed application for Consent under Section 53 of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended. This meeting will be held electronically via Zoom.

Consent File No. C-21-10

The purpose of this consent application is to provide for a new lot in the Rural zone. The property is described as May Township, Concession 4, Lot 10, Parcel 5887, Goltz Road.

The lands subject of this application is not subject of any other Planning Act application.

***TAKE NOTICE** that if you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers on the proposed application, you must make a written request to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers. To appeal the decision to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal, send an appeal form to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers outlining the reasons for the appeal. You must enclose the applicable appeal fee for each application appealed, paid by cheque, made payable to the Ontario Minister of Finance.*

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at the public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the bylaw is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at the public meeting, or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the decision is made, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Tribunal, unless in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

ILLEGAL DUMPING

On June 23, 2021 Council passed Bylaw 2021-25 which prohibits the dumping of waste on private or other property in the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers.

Every person who contravenes any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable, upon conviction, to a fine as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act R.S.O. 1990, c.P.33, as amended.

ATTENTION MASSEY WATER USERS

Bylaw 2003-10 regulates the use of municipal water for lawn and garden care.

- Even numbered houses may water on even-numbered days
- Odd numbered houses may water on odd-numbered days

Watering is only to take place between the hours of **7:00 am and 10:00 am and from 7:00 pm and 10:00pm.**

Failure to comply can result in fines. Complete bylaw available at www.sables-spanish.ca

If you have an outdoor swimming pool, please be sure of the following:

- Open Pool areas shall be totally enclosed by a fence constructed of suitable materials, having a minimum height of 1.5 m [5.0 ft.] with a self-locking gate;
- Where a pool is an above-ground pool, any combination of the pool wall, surrounding fence or structure totalling a minimum of 1.5 m [5.0 ft.] in height shall be deemed to meet the fencing requirements;
- The maximum height of an above-ground swimming pool shall not be more than 2 m [6.56 ft.] above grade.

Massey residents on municipal water will be charged a flat \$100 per year for pool fill-up.



It was so hot in Lloydminster, Alberta

that the one hundred-foot hands on Canada's largest sundial started to spin so fast, it put that province in the Eastern Time Zone.

It was so hot in Alberta, for a three-day period Calgary was hotter than Hell. Really. Calgary was 35° C and Hell, Michigan was only 29° C.

It was so hot in Toronto, city workers had to attach a two hundred-metre straw hat to the top of the CN Tower.

Recipe



Pulled pork sandwiches are one of my favourite things to make when serving a group of people. They are great any time of the year but especially in the summer when you don't want to turn the stove on. Put everything in your slow cooker and walk away. I always make coleslaw to put on them.

Texas Barbecue Pulled Pork

- 3 pounds pork shoulder (or butt)

For the Dry Rub

- 1/4 cup salt
- 1/4 cup black pepper
- 1 tablespoon garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon onion powder
- 1 tablespoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper.



For the Cooking Liquid

- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup apple cider vinegar
- 1 cup ketchup
- 2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon ground mustard
- 1 tablespoon liquid smoke

In a small bowl, mix the Texas dry rub ingredients together. Cut any excess fat from the pork shoulder. Apply the Texas dry rub on all sides of the pork shoulder. You do not need to use all of the dry rub - only use enough to cover the pork. Place the pork shoulder in the slow cooker. In another bowl, mix all of the cooking liquid ingredients together. Pour the cooking liquid into the slow cooker. Cook on low heat for at least 8 hours or until tender. Once the pork is finished cooking, remove it from the slow cooker and shred it using forks. Should be easy when it is nice and tender! Serve on hamburger buns with barbecue sauce and coleslaw. It is also delicious served over nachos.

Espanola Teen Petitioning For A Skateboard Park

A 16-year-old teen in Espanola has over half the signatures he needs on a petition asking council to consider a skateboard park for the town. Kerrnan Legrow says he has been skateboarding for a year but has been into action sports like scootering and biking

since he was seven. He says young people in Espanola deserve a place to enjoy the activity, but because there is no designated area, they end up being kicked off properties for riding a skateboard. He started a petition on change.org, has gathered over 615 signatures and once he reaches 1,000 plans to present his proposal to town council. He adds he has researched a few locations adding he wants to present a plan including a fundraising goal to help cover the costs and a few designs he has come up with. The last time there was a major push for a skateboard park in Espanola was back in 2005 and the town purchased mobile equipment to allow kids to indulge, but that equipment has not been provided in years and is in storage. Legrow hopes to speak to council by mid-summer.

The Manitoulin Health Centre received two donations to go towards the reconstruction of the emergency department at their Mindemoya site.

The centre received a donation of \$10,000 from the Shriener's Haweater Unit.

An earlier donation of \$5,000 brings a total gift of \$15,000 to the project.

Chair of the Shriener's Haweater Group, Willis Campbell, says local children supported by

the organization have received medical care at the Shriener's Hospital in Montreal.

Ted Taylor, a member of the Central Manitoulin Historical Society says their society is pleased to donate \$500 through membership and visitor's fees to the project.

Half of the \$10 million dollar cost is coming from donations from the wider public with the other half coming from reserves. Construction began last week.

A new interactive online elementary treaty education resource is now available thanks to the Anishinabek Nation. "Ezhi-nawending: How we are Related" is a resource that builds on the existing "We are all Treaty People" elementary teacher's kit.

Anishinabek Nation Grand Council Chief Reg Niganobe says it's important to offer content and activities to tell their history, in a fun way, to engage and help young students and learners understand the importance of treaties and the

treaty relationship.

The new online resource is available at anishinabek.ca and includes animation and videos as well as interactive games, a virtual escape room, mapping, and trivia games.

Kelly Crawford, Treaty Educator author of the "We are all Treaty People" teacher's guide, says there has been a fear about getting the information wrong in the past and this will help both students and educators.

"I'll give you an example, if they're in the classroom and they're talking about treaties, and a student asks how many treaties there are in Ontario, we want to be able to support our educators to have the knowledge to be able to answer that question," she says.

"This resource is a good way to bring those voices of our knowledge keepers and our elders into the classroom," Crawford adds.
