By Rosalind Russell - The Chief of Serpent River First Nation, Gimaa Brent Bissaillion, says his community thanks the public for the show of support since the discovery of the graves containing 215 Indigenous children at Kamloops Residential School.

On behalf of his council, he says his First Nation is working behind the scenes with allies to prepare a plan to present to the community in investigating the former residential schools in the local area.

Bissaillion emphasizes this type of historical undertaking cannot be rushed and requires input and consultation from all members of his band and neighbouring bands in Ontario and Quebec.

He adds many children from all over Ontario came to the former schools, and it is a reality that any remains found on the Invisalgin is not for everyone.

He says any members of the public wishing to contribute financially or otherwise, can contact the ban's director of operations and information will be provided as to what action plan will be put in place.

Chi-Cheemaun Set To Sail



The Chi-Cheemaun is set to sail for the summer season.

The Owen Sound Transportation Company, which runs the service, says the ferry resumed operations Tuesday, June 8th.

The company says the vessel runs from May to October between South Baymouth on Manitoulin Island and Tobermory on the Bruce Peninsula, but had delayed the launch this season because of ongoing concerns with COVID-19.

The company adds the ferry's reservation system reopened enabling travellers to reserve their spot either online or by telephone for departures running through the end of the season.

COVID-19 protocols will be in place including limiting the number of individuals who can sail at any given time, maintaining social distance and mandatory wearing of masks.

Espanola Council Passes 2021 Municipal Budget

Espanola taxpayers will see a slight increase in their tax bills this year but they will also see one of the largest capital projects in the town's history completed.

Deputy Mayor Bill Foster, who also chaired the budget committee, says council had been looking at a 1.5% increase in taxes, but thanks to an increase of \$71,072 in new assessment growth the levy portion will come in at 0.63%. Highlights of this year's budget

include the installation of a new trunk main to improve water quality and reliability; the Black Creek Bridge replacement and work on the Town's sewage plant.

Other initiatives include the establishment of reserves for future potential projects including the establishment of a splash pad, dog park and pickleball courts.

The 2021 town budget totals just over \$7-point-seven-million dollars (\$7,744,459).

Recipe

I'll admit I was stumped for a recipe this week, until my friend came to my rescue. She was telling me that she made this loaf using rhubarb



from her garden and it was moist and delicious. She's an amazing cook, so I know it is good!

Strawberry Rhubarb Loaf

- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 cup strawberries cut into pieces
- 1 cup rhubarb cut into small pieces
- 3/4 cup butter, softened
- 2 eggs
- juice and zest from half of a lemon
- 1/4 cup sour cream
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 cup brown sugar

Preheat oven to 350. In a large bowl beat together the butter and white sugar until fluffy. Add the eggs, lemon zest, sour cream and vanilla. Mix until well combined. Add the flour, baking powder and salt and mix until just well combined. Stir in half of the strawberries and half of the rhubarb. Spoon mixture into a well-greased loaf pan. Combine the remaining strawberries and rhubarb into a small bowl. Add the brown sugar and lemon juice. Stir



together. Spoon the fruit over the batter in the pan. Bake for 50 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. Let the loaf cool for 10 minutes in the pan and then turn out onto a wire rack to finish cooling.
