AB Ellis Public School Redesign Plans Released



By Rosalind Russell - The corporation looking to retrofit the AB Ellis Public School in Espanola has completed its feasibility reports, architectural drawings, and input survey from the public.

Corporation spokesperson Fred Yackman says converting the building to senior and low-income housing was the focus of a series of studies carried out by Rainbow Community Non-Profit Housing.

The two architectural renditions depict up to 44 housing units featuring one- and two-bedrooms.

He says there is a draft budget of nearly \$9.4-million dollars to complete the project.

The focus now is to have the architects do a more detailed budget which will then allow the corporation to have an "As Built" assessment of what the renovated building will be worth.

Yackman says the reports have been sent to the Town of Espanola, Domtar, the local social services board, and the Rainbow District School Board.

That in turn will give them a clearer picture of costs to enter talks with potential partners and funding agencies.

No Definitive Plans For School Closing Soon In Espanola



The excitement is growing for the grand opening of the new double school in Espanola, but there are also discussions underway as to what will happen to one of the schools that will close this fall.

Conseil Scolaire Catholique Nouvelon Ontario communication director Paul de la Riva says École St. Joseph elementary school will be closing its doors this summer with the opening of the new École Renaissance.

He points out that the school was renamed École Catholique La Renaissance this year as a first step to the amalgamation with the secondary level, the former Franco-Ouest secondaire.

He says no definite plans have been put in place but usually school boards dispose of their excess space according to a ministry-approved process to offer available excess space to other school boards and government entities.

He adds, however, if no public entity purchases the property, it can be sold to the private sector. De la Riva says more information will be released later in the year once the board reviews all the options.

Huron Central Continues To Operate

The freight rail service between previously denied to them. Sault Ste. Marie and Sudbury will continue to operate.

The negotiations are continuing.

Recipe

An old-fashioned recipe that I was given years ago. At that time, I had 3 large patches of rhubarb and was always looking for ways to use it.



We have since moved, and I miss my patches of rhubarb. Luckily many people have a patch in their yard and are willing to share. For versatility decrease the rhubarb by 1 cup and add 1 cup of sliced strawberries in the spring or 1 cup of diced apples in the fall.

Rhubarb Crisp with a Flour Crumble Topping

- 1 cup of sugar
- ³/₄ cup flour, divided
- ³/₄ tsp ground cinnamon
- 4 cups chopped fresh or frozen rhubarb
- 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
- ½ tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp baking soda
- 1/3 cup butter, melted



In a bowl, combine sugar, 1 tbsp flour and the cinnamon. Add the chopped rhubarb and toss. Place in a greased 9 x 13 baking dish. In a bowl, combine brown sugar, baking powder, baking soda and remaining flour; stir in the butter. Sprinkle over the rhubarb. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes or until the rhubarb is tender. Serve with vanilla ice cream or whipped cream.

Fire Bans In Place In Several Communities

Communities across the North Shore corridor are putting fire bans in place since the current fire rating is extreme.

Espanola. Nairn Centre, Blind River, and Elliot Lake are just some of the local municipalities that either put total fire bans in place or limited burning.

Blind River, Elliot Lake and Nairn Centre have total fire bans in place while Espanola allows backyard pit burning after seven pm under supervision.

Billings Township on Manitoulin Island has also announced a total fire ban.

Since local fire bans and permits differ for each municipality, the public is advised to visit their municipality's website or call the municipal office for the latest fire information.
