Massey Agriculture Society Assists Hundreds Through Free Food Giveaway

Society spokesperson Brian Channon says several agencies such as crisis centers, shelters, and food banks stretching from Elliot Lake to Sudbury were supplied with foodstuffs to fill their shelves.

There were well over 50 volunteers including MP Carol Hughes and several from the Mennonite community and North Shore corridor.

Channon says the giveaways were a way for partners to help those in need who have had difficulties through the pandemic and there could be possibly a third giveaway later in the year.

Request for Tender: Dock Operations Whitefish Falls Dock

The Local Services Board of Rainbow Country will accept sealed, written tenders for a "contract to operate the town dock on the Whitefish River".

The contract term will be for three (3) years: May 1, 2021 to April 30, 2024. The tenders shall include the dollar value for each operating year. Yearly tender amounts are due by June 1 of each contract year.

The successful bidder will be required to show proof of insurance (Certificate of insurance)

The highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

Bidders must enclose a cheque dated June 1, 2021 for the current year of operation with the tender. Tenders may be mailed with a post mark no later than March 26, 2021, be hand delivered to a Board Member or submitted before 7 p.m. at the LSB public meeting on April 6, 2021.

Opening of the sealed tenders and awarding of the contract will take place at the Local Service Board public meeting scheduled for 7 p.m., April 6, 2021 at the Whitefish Falls Community Center, Whitefish Falls, ON.



Thank you, goes out to Sue for sharing this easy and delicious recipe with my daughter. I made it over the weekend for dinner and it was enjoyed by






Lentil Curry (serves 2)

- 1 cup of dried red lentils
- • ¼ cup of low sodium soya sauce
- ½ cup of peanut butter
- 1 900 ml box of vegetable or chicken broth (add enough water to make 4 cups of liquid)
- 2 tsp ginger powder (you can increase to preferred flavour)
- 1 tbsp curry (you can increase to preferred flavour)
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- Chopped peanuts, coriander and plain yogurt are optional

Combine above in a 5-quart saucepan. Bring to a boil. Cover, lower heat and simmer approximately 20 minutes or until thickened; removing lid and stirring when needed. Serve over basmati rice. Can sprinkle with coriander or peanuts and a dollop of plain yogurt when serving.

Former Biidaaban Teacher Has Licence Revoked

A former long-time teacher of Biidaaban elementary School in Sagamok-Anishnawbek First Nation has been found guilty of professional misconduct by the Ontario College of Teachers.

Paul Daniel Fox taught at the school for several years.

In February, the college revoked his teaching licence and imposed a \$10,000 surcharge for payment of case-related costs. Initial allegations were made that Fox had verbally and physically abused several students during his tenure. His licence to teach was suspended in 2017 while a police investigation was carried out.

According to Espanola court records, in 2018, he was charged with nine historical assault charges and granted a conditional sentence; having to pay a fine to victim services as well as receiving a peace bond not to contact any of the victims.

The identity of the victims is protected by a publication ban.

Shot In The Arm For Espanola Hospital Staff

Espanola Regional Hospital and Health Centre health care staff received their first shots of the Pfizer vaccine.

Dr. Andre Michon oversaw the clinic saying the Moderna vaccine was given to residents of the Espanola Nursing Home earlier in February and health care workers, identified as the highest priority, received their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine.

Both Moderna & Pfizer are given in two separate doses a few weeks apart.

Director of Clinical Services Jane Battistelli adds they are anticipating they will bring the team together to vaccinate more health care providers.

The clinic is set up at the Espanola Senior's Drop-In Centre.

Espanola/North Shore Snowarama a success

This year's Snowarama for the Espanola and North Shore area was unusual but still gained financial support.

Regional Easter Seals administrator Carmen Bazinet says riders were able to ride anywhere and anytime over the last month, all while collecting pledges from family and friends.




Theresa Land of Espanola was also the top fundraiser bringing in over \$1,000 for the cause.


