

Paper Excellence Enters Into Agreement To Acquire Domtar For \$55.50 Per Share In Cash



By Rosalind Russell - Domtar shares have been sold to a company based out of British Columbia.

Paper Excellence and Domtar have entered into a strategic business deal with the Paper Excellence group of companies acquiring all Domtar common stock for \$55.50 per share in American dollars.

The all-cash transaction represents an enterprise value of approximately \$3 billion dollars U.S.

After the transaction closes, sometime in late fall, Paper Excellence intends to continue the operations of Domtar as a stand-alone business entity.

As such, Domtar will continue to be led by its management team and Paper Excellence plans to retain its corporate and production locations.

Joe Ragan, Global Chief Financial Officer of Paper Excellence, commented, "We are excited to add Domtar and its employees to the Paper Excellence global family. This marks a

Recipe

This is our favourite salad at our house, and when I say favourite, I mean we eat it at least 3 times a week. I buy romaine lettuce, wash it, cut it and keep it ready in the fridge for this salad. It doesn't contain a lot of ingredients and is very simple to make, but



the sweetness of the oranges and the nuttiness of the pecans, blended with the slightly sweet dressing, is a perfect mix. I prefer this dressing made specifically with vegetable or canola oil. It makes enough dressing for a couple salads.

Romaine Salad with Oranges and Pecans

- 1 head of romaine lettuce or 2 romaine hearts
- ½ -1 can of mandarin oranges
- ³/₄ to 1 cup pecan halves
- 1 tsp salt

- 1 tsp dry mustard
- 1/3 cup apple cider vinegar
- 2 tbsp honey
- 1 cup vegetable or canola oil



Wash and prepare lettuce. In a small bowl, or a jar; mix salt, pepper and dry mustard. Stir in the vinegar and honey. Add the oil. Whisk or shake in a jar. Place salad, drained mandarin oranges and pecans in a large bowl. Pour some of the ī dressing over the salad and toss. Add as much or as little dressing as you like.

Hydro Outages Set For End Of The Month For Upgrades

Espanola Hydro and Hydro One both have planned power outages for the end of the month to upgrade the lines and equipment. Both utilities have planned the outage for Sunday, May 30th from 7:30 am to 1:30 pm.

The areas affected include Espanola, Sables-Spanish Rivers Township, Nairn & Hyman Township, and the Township of Baldwin as well as unorganized areas accessing the utility services.

First Nations Wait For Judge's Ruling Of Appeals

First Nation litigants are now waiting for the judge's final ruling.

Late last month, the Ontario Court of Appeals heard arguments into the appeal of annuities under the Robinson-Huron Treaty and the Ontario government.

With concluding arguments held on April 28th, Mike Restoule the chair of the Robinson Huron Treaty Litigation Fund, says members are pleased with the way the Stage One appeal brought forward by the Ontario government went.

Restoule says the five-member panel of judges heard evidence of the Anishinabek understanding of the treaty, especially the augmentation clause and are also aware that the federal government agrees with the original decision by Justice Patricia Hennessey that annuities should be equitable to today's dollars.

Restoule says the Ontario government's Stage Two appeal regarding Hennessey's decision on no limitations to the plaintiff's claims, which will be heard in June.

The ruling held that signatory First Nations to the 1850 treaty were owed back annuities adjusted to today's dollars after the Crown failed to live up to the terms of the 171-year-old Robinson Huron Treaty of 1850.
