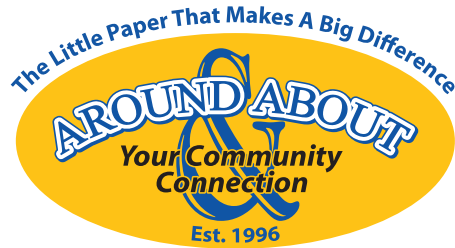

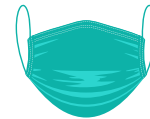

Lion spokesperson Grant Lewis says the toss started with the local Junior A hockey team some years ago but had to be switched up to meet COVID-19 protocols last year. The toss will continue in a similar fashion this year, with the public invited to toss their teddy bears or other stuffies November 27th from 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm with donors invited to toss them at the cannon near the Legion's main entrance. He says the stuffies are collected as part of the Agnes Michon Lions Toy Drive. Lewis adds there will also be hotdogs and hot chocolate available.

## Renewal Of OPP Contract For Espanola Means More Savings

The Town of Espanola has saved just over a million dollars in policing since eliminating the municipal service three years ago and bringing in the Ontario Provincial Police.

A report being released to Espanola council will detail how money was saved with the switch.

The report also points out that there were savings because of the decrease in court costs due to the pandemic and that will

need an adjustment once the system returns to normal.

Council will also be discussing the new contract showing estimated OPP costs for 2022 at just over \$1.26 million based on the OPP standard costing model.

This estimate is made up of base service, call for service, overtime, court security, and prisoner transportation, and includes a \$10,563 credit which came from a 2020-year end adjustment.

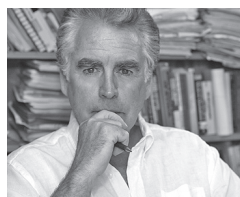

## My New Family Doctor Is Also The Clinic's Assistant/Receptionist/Cleaning Lady

Have you noticed that our healthcare system is overworked, under appreciated and shrinking faster than a violet under a UV lamp?!!?

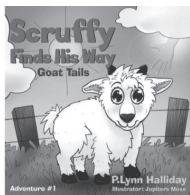

## Recipe

My friend shared this delicious recipe with me that her family enjoys. Even if you are not eating low carb, you'll enjoy this light but flavourful casserole that is quick and easy to make. It's also a great way to sneak some extra vegetables into the kids.

### Low Carb Taco Casserole

- 10 ounces Frozen Cauliflower Rice
- 2-3 Tablespoons Oil
- 2 Lbs Ground Beef
- 1 Small Red Bell Pepper - seeded, chopped
- 1 Small White Onion - chopped
- 4 Tablespoons Taco Seasoning
- 1 Tablespoon Tomato Paste
- 1/2 Cup Water
- 3 Cups Shredded Colby/Jack Cheese
- 1 Cup Sour Cream
- Optional Toppings: Chopped Lettuce, Chopped Tomato, Sliced Black Olives, Avocado/Guacamole, Cilantro, Sliced Jalapeno, Salsa, Hot Sauce

Preheat oven to 350°F. Pan fry the cauliflower rice in oil over medium/high heat until browned. Transfer to greased 2qt casserole dish and spread in an even layer. Brown ground beef with red pepper and onion over medium/high heat. Drain excess fat if necessary, then add taco seasoning, tomato paste and water. Stir and cook until liquid absorbs. Transfer to casserole dish in an even layer on top of cauliflower rice. Top with shredded cheese and bake for 10-15 minutes. Spread sour cream over the top. Sprinkle with extra shredded cheese and preferred toppings.

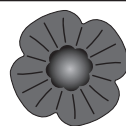
## OBITUARY



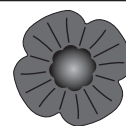
