A resident is hoping Sables-Spanish Rivers Township will consider going through the process of changing to a ward system.

Brian Channon says municipalities are just over

a year away from another election and he wants to ensure the township, which includes Massey and Webbwood as well as several rural residents, have equal representation.

He says council did try to solve the problem by filling a vacancy with someone from Webbwood, but that move led to loss of representation for some 600 residents of Massey. Channon says the problem can be easily solved if council puts a motion on the floor to change to a ward system with fair representation based on population.

He says if council will not consider the idea, he is prepared to submit a petition to them for consideration.

"Let's say you organized a caucus retreat and you needed a guest speaker. Who comes to mind?"


"Well, my mother and my brother have considerable experience."

Recipe

These soft and chewy maple snickerdoodles are so easy to make and are perfect for fall. The pure maple syrup flavour adds a sweet twist on the classic snickerdoodle



recipe. If you'd like even more maple flavour, you can replace some or all the vanilla extract with maple extract. Be sure to chill the dough to prevent cookies from spreading.

Maple Snickerdoodles

- 3/4 cup butter, softened
- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup pure maple syrup
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 egg
- 2 tsp baking soda
- 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp cream of tartar
- 1/2 tsp salt

Cinnamon Sugar Coating

- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 Tbsp ground cinnamon



Cream butter, granulated sugar, and brown sugar together, until light and fluffy.

Add in maple syrup, vanilla extract, and egg; beat until well combined. Sift dry ingredients together in a separate bowl, and slowly incorporate into the wet ingredients.

Chill dough for at least 1 hour. Preheat oven to 375 degrees and line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Mix cinnamon and sugar together in a small bowl. Roll dough into about 1 1/2" balls, and the roll in cinnamon sugar. Place 2" apart on the baking sheet, and bake for 8-10 minutes, or until tops have cracked and the cookies are set.

The meeting is held pursuant to the provisions of Section 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P.13.

*Due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, this Public Meeting may be held virtually. Please contact the Clerk for meeting information.

TAKE NOTICE THAT the application for a rezoning is deemed to be a complete application for the purposes of Section 34 (10.4) of the Planning Act.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT of the application is to update the lot area data for the Agnew Lake Property Group subdivision. The minimum lot areas were established in By-law # 2020-25, an amending zoning by-law. The lot areas have since been refined following a legal survey associated with the finalizing of the plan of subdivision. There is no change to the permitted land uses or other information set out in By-law 2020-25. The effect is to enact a technical amendment to confirm the lot areas for existing uses and any potential future development within the approved subdivision. See Key Map.

IF A PERSON OR PUBLIC BODY would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Township of Nairn & Hyman to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Nairn & Hyman before the by-law is passed the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.




