

### Espanola Council Signs Lease For Tennis And Pickleball

Espanola council has given its approval to signing a lease with the Espanola Golf & Country Club for tennis and pickleball courts.

Council has agreed to execute an agreement between the town and the golf club for the public use of the tennis and pickleball courts belonging to the Espanola Golf and Country Club.

As to the proposed renovations, that is a matter for future discussion.

A proposal is still on the table to look at upgrading the courts for the shared sports, which will be discussed at upcoming meetings

## Tender Accepted For Complex Roof Repair And Dehumidifier

Espanola council has given approval to a tender to repair the roof at the complex and the installation of a new dehumidifier.

Public Works manager Joel Yusko says a roof assessment was carried out last year to see what was causing ice damming and summer condensation.

He says corrosion was found and the report identified that some work had to be carried out to repair and prevent any further damage. Council had approved the tender be awarded to SRS Contracting for \$494,400 plus taxes.

He adds the municipality will receive up to 25% funding for the project from the NOHFC Community Rural and Enhancement Fund.

Yusko says the project includes replacing the dehumidifier, installing a reflective ceiling, repairing damaged flashing, and installing a heat trace along the eave to mitigate ice damming.

Espanola council agreed to continue providing their live link on their home page and archive the meetings to YouTube for the public to review at any time.

Council has also decided to video and audio tape their closed sessions, but those tapes will be kept securely on file.

Council agreed the town clerk will be responsible for authorizing access to such records in accordance with applicable legislation.

The move will provide legal protection to councillors and the municipality but also protect individuals or private matters protected by the Municipal Act and other legislation.

## Recipe

This recipe for potato wedges is my new favourite. The combination of garlic, Italian seasoning and parmesan makes a delicious



appetizer or side dish. Be sure to use russet potatoes, for best results. They can be dipped in your favourite salad dressing or in ketchup.

#### **Baked Garlic Parmesan Potato Wedges**

- 3-4 large russet potatoes skin on, sliced into wedges
- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- ½ cup shredded parmesan cheese
- Ketchup, ranch, or blue cheese dressing for dipping

Preheat oven to 375. Lightly grease a large baking sheet or line with parchment paper and set aside. Place potato wedges in a large bowl. Drizzle with olive oil and toss to coat. In a small bowl whisk together salt, garlic powder, and Italian seasoning. Sprinkle potato wedges with the shredded cheese, tossing to coat, then sprinkle with the seasoning mixture. Place potato wedges on prepared baking sheet in a single layer with skin-sides-down. Bake for 25-35 minutes until potatoes are fork-tender and golden. Serve with your favourite dipping sauce.
