



Peltier to Address I-A-C-C National Event

The Indigenous Arts Collective of Canada is making plans for a second annual ceremony on Parliament Hill which will include a Manitoulin Island activist.

The organization is hosting a "children and youth led" ceremony mark to National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The event will feature a memorial to commemorate

the lives of children who died at residential schools, as well as a "giving circle" showing appreciation towards survivors. Wiikwemkoong's Autumn Peltier, an activist and the Chief Water commissioner for the Anishinabek Nation, will also be at the event as a guest speaker.

The I-A-C-C is hosting the ceremony on the 30th of September.

Ghost Guns Made On 3-D Printers

Two men were arrested last week, after the discovery of so-called "ghost guns" in B.C. The Canada Border Services Agency says they discovered firearm parts in international mail arrivals during the spring and followed up with raids on two locations.

Officers found several handguns that had been printed with 3-D printers.

Public Safety Minister Marco Mendicino says these ghost guns pose a "serious risk" because they're easy to make and almost impossible to trace.





It may not be largest in the world, but it looks to be a contender for the Ontario OFAH Record Registry Ryder Beauregard caught this 20 pound Bowfin in the Bay of Islands recently.

The longest bowfin ever caught worldwide measured 34.3 in (870 mm) in length, while the largest bowfin fish caught in the United States (South Carolina) weighed 21 Lbs. 8 oz. (9.8 kg), back on November 17th, 2021. However, Beauregard's efforts could be recognized as an Bang Bang - FB

Ontario record ... According to the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters, the largest bowfin was caught by Mark Johnson in Dog Lake, Ontario back on June 27th, 2000 coming in at 15.10 pounds.

Ford Says Feds Need to Pay Out More on Health Care

Premier Doug Ford says new beds. Ontario isn't alone when it comes to hospital unit closures.

Ford says hospitals around the world are currently dealing with staffing shortages.

He says the government is dealing with the situation by hiring more than ten-thousand new healthcare workers, as well as adding 31 hundred

Ford adds provinces across Canada need more financial support from the federal government to help address issues like this.

He says it's not a sustainable situation when Ottawa is only paying 22 percent of the total health care bill.

The premiers have demanded that be raised to 35 percent.
