Pope Issues Formal Apology

By Rosalind Russell- Pope Francis is asking for forgiveness for what he calls the evil committed by so many Christians against Indigenous Peoples. Francis says he is "deeply sorry" in his first public apology for the Catholic Church's role in the residential school system in Canada.

His speech was delivered at the site of one of the largest institutions in Alberta. He added he feels deep shame and remorse and says the memory of children who attended the schools is painful and every child should be treated with love, honour, and respect.

The move is being supported by both Elliot Lake Pride, which would like to see a two-spirit centre built on the site, and ELNOS, the local business corporation.

Ontario North Pride representative, Douglas Elliot says if reconciliation is the goal, then the land could be put to good use with the building of an innovative centre for

two-spirited and other people. ELNOS general manager, William Elliot, says the plan to sell the former MNR site north of the city to Serpent River First Nation is a good one, and one that can have concrete benefits for both communities. Council listened to the presentations and in the end, agreed to move ahead with the sale of the property on Highway 108 in the interests of economic and community development, and in the interests of reconciliation.

Getting Ready for the School Year

Ontario is laying out its plan to help students catch up after two years of disruption because of the pandemic.

Education Minister Stephen Lecce says it's supported by his government's historic investments in education and starts with students being back in classrooms, on time.

It also includes the full school experience with extra-curriculars like clubs, band, and field trips.

Lecce says the plan is made up of five components including new tutoring supports to fill gaps in learning, preparing students for the jobs of tomorrow, and providing more money to build schools and improve education.

The province has allocated \$26.5 billion for elementary and secondary education for the upcoming school year.

While the plan is based around in-person learning, parents will still have the choice to have their kids learn from home.

Meanwhile, with contracts expiring with all education unions as of the end of August, Lecce says he expects classes to start on time with all of the experiences they deserve.


