By Rosalind Russell - The Moose radio stations in Elliot Lake and Espanola have the final figures for their respective radiothons.

The "It is IN YOU to GIVE" Campaign hosted by the Moose 99.3 FM in Espanola raised nearly \$33,400 for the Espanola Hospital Foundation, over one-third of the \$90,000 needed for the three pieces of lab equipment.

Elliot Lake's Moose 94.1 FM raised a record-breaking \$8,000 in toys and \$7,700 in cash as part of the Christmas Toy Drive for the Salvation Army.

Both stations extend a thank you to the wider community on behalf of all the partners and volunteers involved in the radiothons.

Manitoulin Phragmites Project A Success In 2022

The Manitoulin Phragmites Project has been a part of Manitoulin Island for the last seven years, but with some major successes fighting the invasive plants this year.

Judith Jones who leads the project says the organization had some major accomplishments this year in fighting the tall, invasive grass including having Phragmites under control or eradicated on all the Lake Huron shore from South Baymouth to Burnt Island.

She adds almost all the South Bay shoreline from South Baymouth to McGaw Point has also been cleared.

Jones adds major work has been taking part on the north shore of Lake Wolsey and around Julia Bay, as well as being almost half done controlling a major infestation in Little Thomas Bay on Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory.

She says she has applied for two grants and hopes to hear from them early next year to continue the work during the warm months of 2023.

Some statistics on the project: • Total number of sites worked: 45 (incl. sites by volunteers & partners other than MTO) • Total area worked: 40.3 ha

• Total area of habitat in which control took place: 505 ha

• Number of house calls made to new locations: 4

• Number of sites where new Phrag Watchers (volunteer stewards) were set up: 7

• Number of sites with Phrag Watchers now in place: 66

• Number of people who are Phrag Watchers: 55

• Number volunteers who worked with the project (other than Phrag Watchers): 10

• Number of boat launches checked for Phrag: 16; Number with Phrag: 0

In 2022 control and/or maintenance was done at 45 sites. The number seems lower than in previous years, but we now count multiple spots all under control on one shoreline (like Sheguiandah to White's Point or everywhere in Julia Bay) as one site. Even with updated counting, there are now over 100 sites with Phragmites under control or eradicated.


