Baxter Cup Goes To Espanola This Year

By Rosalind Russell - One of the longest-running, friendly sports feuds has ended this year with the Espanola Curling Club coming out on top with the Baxter Cup.

The Baxter cup competition has been going on for an astounding 97 years between the Espanola club and its counterpart in Little Current.

The cup is named after George Baxter, a salesman who arrived in Little Current in 1910 and established the competition in 1925.

It has been a staple of the curling family and is recognized at the national level for its longevity.

Originally the Baxter Cup games were twelve ends (natural ice in February), but this changed to ten ends and the number of teams increased to ten from eight. They now play eight ends with a break in the middle. Total score of the ten games (5 at each Club) determines the winner. Four trustees, two from each club, see to it that the tradition continues.

Starting in 1925, it survived The Depression, accidental dips in the North Channel, the Cup being stolen (and found), World War 2, and horrendous weather. In fact, when they first started out, there was no Highway Six, only the rail line, so players would travel back and forth on the train to take part.

Each side has several players who have participated for twenty or more years. This year is the 97th and somehow, despite the pandemic and other challenges, the dedicated curlers continue the tradition.





Project Lifesaver launches on Manitoulin Island and in Espanola

By Rosalind Russell - Espanola and Manitoulin Island are now benefitting from Project Lifesaver, in partnership with the Manitoulin OPP.

Constable John Hill, who is also

the community safety officer, says Project Lifesaver utilizes a wristband, radio frequency and antennas, which uses a frequency-based tracking system to keep track of or find high-risk individuals who go missing.

He says these vulnerable individuals can include those diagnosed with Alzheimer's, other dementias, or other forms of cognitive delay.

Hill says the client wears a personalized wristband that emits a unique signal so when someone goes missing, trained OPP officers can respond to the area where the lost person was last seen and carry out a search with a mobile location tracking

He says the support of Domtar and the Manitoulin Northshore Victim Services were vital in launching Project Lifesaver, thanking them for their support.
