

## **NDP Focus On The Opioid Crisis**

NDPMPs Charlie Angus of Timmins-James Bay and Carol Hughes Algoma-Manitoulin - Kapuskasing are backing the party's first initiative in the new parliamentary session – a private member's bill that would help families dealing with loved ones who use or are addicted to drugs.

Angus says if passed, among other things the NDP's bill would decriminalize drug possession for personal use and expand access to crucial harm reduction, treatment, and recovery services.

Northern Ontario has been touched by the

opioid crisis in some way.

Hughes adds it is time to stop treating people who are addicted like criminals and get them the help they need adding the bill will save lives.

Last year, Toronto and the province of BC applied to the federal government for the decriminalization of drugs for personal use, a step recommended by the Liberal government's own Expert Task Force on substance use.

In 2020 alone, the opioid crisis claimed He adds practically everyone living in 4,395 lives in Canada, which is equivalent to 12 deaths a day.

# **Gelinas Writes To Health Minister About Meds And Costs**

Nickel Belt MPP France Gelinas says she has written to Ontario Health Minister Christine Elliot about concerns raised by constituents about prescription medications and the costs involved.

She says constituents are telling her that to continue accessing prescription renewals, their physicians are prompting them to pay a third-party company that they have contracted, for a service they used to get for free.

She says a constituent inquired with her doctor's office about what she could do to avoid paying the new fees and was informed that the only way was with an

in-person visit with her doctor.

Gelinas says the woman would have to wait four weeks for a visit, but that was not an option with running out of her medications so she ended up having to pay \$20 to renew her prescription and an extra \$10 to have it renewed the same day. Gelinas says she believes the minister will agree with her that refilling a prescription for \$20 is a barrier to proper health care and is too expensive for some to pay. She adds she is hoping to get a prompt

response from the minister.
