Public Health Sudbury & Districts Has Implemented Several Measures To Prepare For The Omicron Variant.

Dr. Penny Sutcliffe, Medical Officer of Health says Omicron has an alarming ability to spread very quickly and is expected to bring about the most challenging wave yet of the COVID-19 pandemic. She says additional measures include a focus on vaccinating children five to 11 years of age and booster shots to try and get ahead of the wave. Dr. Sutcliffe says recent modelling from the Science Advisory Table shows Omicron could push COVID-19 cases to new heights in a matter of days. She adds local resources are already stretched due to the recent surge of Delta in the area including deaths involving younger individuals in their 30s, 50s, and 60s. Vaccination across Greater Sudbury and in the Sudbury and Manitoulin districts, with the threat of the Omicron variant, it is highly recommended to get a booster dose of the COVID-19 vaccine to protect

against serious disease from COVID-19. Public Health has redeployed all remaining staff resources to quickly ramp up local capacity and vaccination appointments. As more individuals become eligible for booster doses, including those 18 and older starting December 20, 2021, every effort is being made to offer booster doses locally, including offering more walkin opportunities, extending clinic hours, and requesting more doses from the province. The health unit says despite their best efforts, they will not be able to vaccinate everyone eligible in a matter of weeks. They remain focused protecting those who are most at risk, such individuals with underlying health conditions, health care workers and their families, individuals who live or work in congregate settings, and those over the age of 50 and ask for your continued patience.

Pope Francis has recognized the life of service of a local Catholic priest, Fr. Guy Albert. Fr. Albert was notified in December that the pope has named him an honorary "Chaplain of His Holiness", a title granted for service to the people and contributions to the life of the church.

The honour also comes with the title of Monsignor.

Throughout his 45 years of ministry as a priest, Albert served at 16 different parishes in Sudbury, Sault Ste. Marie, Sturgeon Falls and many places in between. He is currently the pastor at St. Jean de Brebeuf Church in Sudbury. The title of Chaplain of His Holiness is approved by the Pope after a recommendation from the local bishop.

Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie

Bishop Thomas Dowd plans to officially celebrate the honour with Msgr. Albert at weekend Masses at St. Jean de Brebeuf Church.

"When Bishop Dowd called me and told me about this news, I said 'Are you serious?', and he assured me that he was," recalled Fr. Albert, "I was astonished, I felt unworthy of this title, thinking what I have done to receive this?"

"The news is still sinking in," said Fr. Albert, "the reaction of the people that I've told - they're just as happy as I am, and to hear their comments have been really uplifting to me, I am grateful to God for them and all the people I have served."

"I offer my congratulations and prayers to Msgr. Albert, a priest who has dedicated his life to the people of God," said Bishop Dowd, Bishop of the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie. "This honour recognizes the dedication and pastoral care he has offered to so many through his priestly ministry, and in particular his special devotion to the people during the pandemic."

In 2013, Pope Francis altered the process requiring those nominated to be at least above the age of 65, to avoid a type of clericalism in the Church.

JANUARY 2021

LOCKDOWN BREAKING COMES INTO EFFECT BOXING DAY - SCHOOLS ALSO AFFECTED - SMALL BUSINESS GRANT AVAILABLE - As COVID-19 cases continue to rise at an alarming rate, the Ontario government, in consultation with the Chief Medical Officer of Health and other health experts, is imposing a Provincewide Shutdown. Additional restrictions will be put into place and reinforce that Ontarians should stay at home as much as possible to minimize transmission of the virus and prevent hospitals from becoming overwhelmed. The Provincewide Shutdown will go

"The number of daily cases continue to rise putting our hospitals and long-term care homes at risk," said Premier Ford. "We need to stop the spread of this deadly virus. That's why, on the advice of Dr. Williams and other health experts, we are taking the difficult but necessary decision to shutdown the province and ask people to stay home. Nothing is more important right now than the health and safety of all Ontarians."

OPP INVESTIGATES SHOOTING IN ESPANOLA

On Thursday, January 21, 2021, members of the Manitoulin Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police responded to a shooting incident on Albert Street in Espanola.

A person suffered a gunshot wound and was transported to hospital. Witnesses observed numerous people running away from the house afterwards.

The OPP and Greater Sudbury Police Service Tactical Unit arrested three individuals a short time later in Lively, just outside of Greater Sudbury.

The three individuals have each been charged with attempt to commit murder using a restricted firearm and break & enter.

The OPP is asking for assistance in locating two persons of interest who left the residence after the shooting.

At this time, the Mill was still being used as a prisoner of war camp and Mom (living close by on Grey Street) could hear the Germans singing their Cantata at Christmas time. She always remarked how beautiful their voices sounded.

Around 1961 she left the mill and started work as a bookkeeper for the Espanola Garage, which her father Fabian had opened during the Great Depression and her brother Lolo now operated. In the 70's, new management at the garage took over and she retired. She spent a couple of years doing payroll for the local golf course. Mom finally retired to spend time with her children and grandkids and was fortunate to have been able to spend time with her great grandchildren. The whole family benefited from spending time with Mom.

Retirement resulted in many trips with friends to golf and gamble small amounts at the casino. Wherever Marney went, she had fun, and so did her companions.
