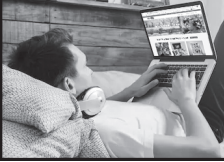

By Rosalind Russell - An Espanola bowler is off to nationals to represent Northern Ontario.

Sixty-two-year-old David Secord has been bowling for around 55 years and has won many championships, but this is a first in winning the Master Bowlers of Northern Ontario season in five-pin.

Secord says he will be heading to Edmonton, Alberta on June 30th for five days of competition at the nationals, a first in his long career in the sport.

He adds he not only loves the game, but also coaches youngsters as young as five

years old and is looking forward to sharing his photos and stories with them when he returns, hopefully as national champion. He is not only representing the north, but Venture Lanes, which has also been a part of Espanola for over six decades.

Secord says bowling has a long history in Espanola with three separate bowling alleys providing a venue through the decades.

"Before Venture Lanes was built by Al Pacey in the 1950s, there were two others in Espanola. They were not mechanical lanes and had kids whose job it was to stand the pins up and return the bowling balls to the players. One of them was in the former H&R Block building on Tudhope Street, which still has two lanes in the basement. The other is on Secord Avenue, which also had two lanes in the basement and pool hall upstairs, but that has been converted to a residence now.

"When Mr. Pacey built the

original Espanola Bowling Alley, he brought in and installed mechanical systems, so the other bowling alleys eventually closed. In fact, Venture Lanes is one of only two remaining free fall bowling alleys in Canada," explains Secord. "That machines pick up and place the pins and mechanically returns the bowling balls to the players."

The bowling alley is also known as a movie set. The cast of the 2015 movie, Born To Be Blue starring Ethan Hawke travelled to Espanola to shoot a bowling scene when they realized that Sudbury didn't have a 10-pin bowling alley.

Secord looks forward to adding to that history.

"We are not an extreme sport, but it will be a challenge to take on these younger players at nationals, but if you are healthy and mobile, it is anyone's game. It is a pleasant alternative to more aggressive sports and lends its own excitement. Wish me luck!"

Road Construction Beginning On Highway Six South Of Espanola

There are major construction areas along Highway Six this summer, and some repairs are underway on the iconic Swing Bridge in Little Current.

The first is a major section of highway, some 16 kilometres from Birch Island on the Whitefish River First Nation heading south to Little Current.

The Ministry of Transportation states it is likely to take up to two years to complete all the work on that section of highway, so motorists can expect slow-downs right into late fall.

There is also repair work underway on the Swing Bridge in Little Current, so motorists can expect slowdowns there as well.

Summer School Available For Rainbow Students

The Rainbow District School Board will offer in-person Summer School remedial and upgrading courses at the secondary level.

Board communication manager Nicole Charette says in-person summer school starts July 4th and ends August 3rd.

She says students must have taken the course during the current academic school year, must have access to a computer and the Internet in the event there are public health restrictions that require a pivot to

remote learning.

Charette says courses include English, Math, Science, History, Geography, Civics and Careers and are open to students from any school board, but transportation will not be provided.

Indian Day School Claims Deadline Coming Up

Members of Sagamok-Anishnabek First Nation are approaching the deadline to make an Indian Day School claim.

According to the release, a claim can be made by anyone including a deceased person who attended Indian Day School, either at Sagamok, Sagamok R or River Road schools, in the community before the school closed in 1973.

The claim for the deceased can only be made for someone who passed away on or after July 31st, 2007.

Applicants must bring their identification, and in the case of someone who has passed, death certificate, will and authorized representative, as well as original claim forms and/or appeals file to St. Raphael's Rectory.

The deadline is July 13th.
