Town Mourning Loss Of Active Volunteer – Yves Carriere

In a statement, the Espanola Regional Hospital & Health Centre states Carriere was a member of the board and a strong advocate of providing the highest quality care to the community.

He was also a member of the Executive Committee and chaired several other committees throughout his time with the board.

The hospital has lowered its flags to halfmast to honour him.

The Town of Espanola also acknowledged his active role as the vice-chair of the local police board by lowering the municipal flags last Monday.

He was 61.

Landfill Contract Turned Down For The Second Time By Espanola Council

Espanola council has turned down a costs of the packaging and recycling their contract with the local landfill operator for a second time.

Council held a lengthy discussion about a proposed ten-year contract, which would have seen ratepayers reducing their garbage bags from four a week to two within a year and the continued use of black bags rather than clear ones.

A contentious issue over the last year, this was the second time staff had gone back to negotiate a deal with Dodge Haulage, the owner of the landfill.

The sticking point is the lack of action by the provincial government regarding having producers legislated to carry the products generate.

Councillor Ken Duplessis suggested a one-year contract be put in place to allow time to see what the upper levels of government would mandate.

He suggested the contract be revamped to one year, which would also provide education to the public and the new council can make the decision.

In the end though, council decided not to defer the discussion, but instead defeated the motion with a tie vote. That means staff will now consider the councils' concerns and go back to the negotiating table with the landfill operator.

Thousands Of Blood Donors Needed But No Clinics

Canadian Blood Services cancelled all their blood donor clinics throughout the northeast in 2019, but there is a dire shortage in donations according to one of its vice-presidents.

Chief supply chain officer and donor relations vice-president Rick Prinzen says the CBS needs 100,000 new donors to ensure needs are met, but due to the pandemic, the number of regular donors dropped by around 31,000 people.

Prinzen says the only blood donor site serving the northeast is in Sudbury, where

plasma is collected.

Mobile clinics including those in Espanola and Elliot Lake were cancelled when the clinic began collecting plasma because of the impact of having to ship blood quickly to manufacturing sites and the cost and work needed in manning the mobile sites.

He adds the clinics are unlikely to return, but if anyone wishes to donate, they can check out the site blood.ca to see if a donor clinic can fit into their travel plans.

Former Northern Ontario Priest Brings Book Tour To Espanola


A former priest has written a book that addresses topics including clergy abuse, residential schools, secondclass citizenship of women and the LGBTQ community.
