

Espanola councillors have decided to go back to the election of 2018 in filling a vacant position on council. Espanola council has six meetings left before the end of its term, so with the removal of Maureen Van Alstine as councillor, the rest had to

decide how to fill the vacancy. Van Alstine was removed from her position two weeks ago after being found guilty in court of violations of the Municipal Act.

Town Clerk Joseph Burke had suggested a motion that council post the vacancy for two weeks and council choose from members of the public who had expressed an interest in filling the position.

However, Councillor Ken Duplessis says there were seven candidates in the last election and Ron Duplessis, a former councillor who lost in the 2018 election, should be asked if he would be interested in filling the position.

The motion was amended and if Ron Duplessis turns down the invitation, then the position will be posted publicly.

Town clerk Joseph Burke says he is aware of some residents concerns that garbage is not being picked up citing the town entered a new contract with GFL Environmental, the new provider, a couple of weeks ago. He says the town is aware of the concerns of the new contract, which has new requirements relating to the placement of garbage and recycling for pick-

### **New Horizons Funding Supports Seniors On** Manitoulin Island

Several communities on Manitoulin Island will senior investing in programming, thanks to New Horizons funding from the federal government.

The Township of Assiginack will receive \$19,400 for a pickleball program while the Township of Tekhummah will use just over \$17,000 for healthy snacks and fitness equipment geared to seniors. The NEMI Public Library is receiving \$25,000 for its COMPASS program to develop a virtual reality system and book program while the Silver Water Recreation Centre received over \$16,000 for upgrading the community hall and purchasing digital and internet service to provide digital training to seniors.

The Whitefish River First Nation is also receiving \$25,000 for its Elders Good Life of Living Program geared to workshops and lifestyle mentoring.

### **Province Agrees To Buy Laurentian University Assets**

Manitoulin Island School Wins **Cleanup Challenge** 

Documents filed before the courts on May 24 revealed that the province has agreed purchase Laurentian University assets while the institution continues to look for ways to pay of its creditors. According to Northern Ontario Business, the province is looking at buying up to \$53.5 million dollars of assets.

University president Robert Haché stated in a May 23rd affidavit that the terms of this agreement would allow the University to make 100 per cent of such net sale proceeds available to its creditors under the bankruptcy proceedings

as real estate transactions are completed.

He adds the university anticipates it would be able to continue to use and occupy the property, be it real estate or buildings.

The university owes nearly \$360 million to creditors and filed for creditor protection over a year ago.

He adds the university intends to return to court on to ask that the stay of proceedings protecting the university from its creditors be extended once again to September 30th since the current stay of proceedings are set to expire.
