### **Espanola Council Approves** Splash Pad – Road Work Will Be Done Separately

By Rosalind Russell - Espanola council has given its approval to have ABC Recreation build the new splash pad at Sherwood Park in early summer.

Evaluators were unanimous in their review of the proposed pad being 2,480 square feet in size with a spray area of 1,500 square feet, and including 19 features as well as two wheelchair accessible activators.

Council has approved the project at a total cost of \$220,000.

Public Works/Leisure Services Manager Joel Yusko says that amount does not include widening the roadway to accommodate parking concerns, which is a separate budgeted item.

He says \$148,000 has been budgeted to widen the road to address parking issues. With the approval, construction of the splash pad itself is expected to start in early June, as well as the road work.

A grand opening is tentatively planned for early July.

### Notice of Canadian Navigable Waters Act Application

Ministry of Transportation Ontario hereby gives notice that an application has been made to the Minister of Transport, pursuant to the Canadian Navigable Waters Act for approval of the work described herein and its site and plans.


Pursuant to paragraph 7(2) of the said Act, the Ministry of Transportation Ontario has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<a href="http://cps.canada.ca/">http://cps.canada.ca/</a>) under the NPP File Number 2016-400103 a description of the following work, its site and plans:

- Replacement of existing railing system;
- Coating of structural steel girders;
- Replacement of expansion joints;
- Concrete patch repairs to various elements including piers, abutments and wingwalls;
- Removal of existing curb, and;
- Waterproofing and paving.

The construction will be carried out in two stages over two years in order to maintain one open lane, two-way traffic. Temporary Traffic Signals will be set up to control the one-lane, two-way traffic during construction.

The construction work will be undertaken across the Spanish River located on Highway 7300, approximately 1 km south of Highway 17, Section 36 within the within the Township of Sable-Spanish River, Geographic Township of Salter, Sudbury District

### Former Espanola Resident Wins Bronze For Autobiography


