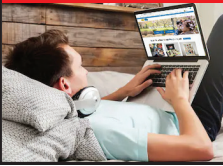
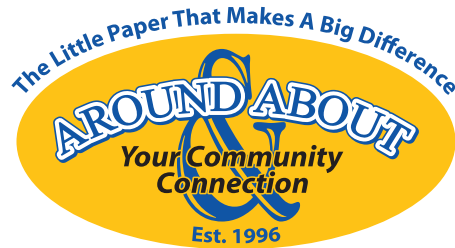

Long-Time Espanola Business Changes Hands



By Rosalind Russell - After over three decades of greening lawns, plowing snow and local beautification projects, a successful, long-time Espanola business is changing hands.

Greenway Landscaping, headed up by Jeff Dormer, has been a part of Espanola for over 30 years, but Dormer says it is time to hang up the rake and retire.

Dormer says he founded the business with one truck and a lawnmower 32 years ago this month.

"I was looking for work at that time and noticed that there was an opportunity to provide services I was trained in," recalls Dormer. "I decided I would take the skills in landscaping I had acquired in Alberta and bring them here."

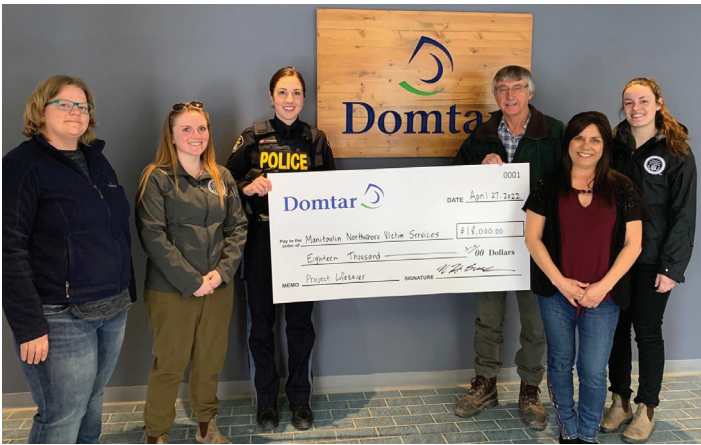

Project Lifesaver Coming To Manitoulin



The Manitoulin Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) and Manitoulin Northshore Victim Services (MNVS) is proud to announce that Project Lifesaver is coming to the Manitoulin Island and Espanola area. The OPP and MNVS are looking forward to working closely with North Shore Search and Rescue throughout this endeavour.

Project Lifesaver is a radio frequency based tracking system. The technology has been around for many years. It is accurate, simple, and dependable. The system is for people of all ages who are high risk vulnerable persons. They must have a tendency to “wander” and have been diagnosed with Alzheimer’s or other dementias, Autism, Down syndrome or other form of cognitive delay.

“Manitoulin Northshore Victim Services is pleased to partner with the OPP to deliver Project

Lifesaver on Manitoulin Island and the North Shore,” said MNVS Executive Director, Tanya Wall. “We also want to acknowledge the years of service that the North Shore Search and Rescue Group has had in bringing this critical service to our area. We are proud to continue on as the new administrator of the program. We are especially grateful to Domtar for being the lead sponsor of this life saving program,” said Wall. Project Lifesaver clients wear a personalized wristband that emits a unique tracking signal. When caregivers notify police that the person is missing, in addition to regular police resources, Project Lifesaver trained OPP officers respond to the area where the lost person was last seen and searches the area with a mobile location tracking system. The Project Lifesaver wristband is a one ounce, battery-operated wrist transmitter emitting a unique FM radio frequency-based signal that

emits a signal every second, 24 hours a day.

The signal can be tracked on the ground for approximately 2.5 kilometers, or in the air from the helicopter, approximately 8-10 kilometres. As each wristband has a unique radio frequency, the Project Lifesaver team can positively locate and identify the person who has wandered away from home using portable directional antennae to locate the signal. The transmitter (in the bracelet) is powered by a battery

that is changed approximately every 60 days. Caregivers are provided with a battery tester and are required to manually test the battery daily.

“We are pleased to support this project that will enhance the safety of community members”, said Norm Bush, general manager of the Domtar pulp and paper mill. “This technology will support the important work done by the Manitoulin Northshore Victim Services in the region and we are pleased to be a part of it.”

Over the years, he built up the business, added more trucks and equipment, created jobs and expanded to include lawn care and landscaping in the warm months, plowing and snow removal in the winter. Dormer also changed the look of many facilities in Espanola.
