SCHOOL BOARDS

RESULTS: In the school boards' races Marie Murphy-Foran won the Algoma District School Board (Public) trustee seat with 1,196. She beat out Andrew Ault by 68 votes. Debbie Shamas handily defeated Amber Brown for the seat on the board as well, 804 to 278. In the race for the Huron-Superior Catholic District School Board Lindsay Liske is returning with 302 votes and will be joined at the meetings with Reginald Simon with 285 votes. Kathy Rosilius was defeated with 224 votes. Lisa Corbiere-Addison has been

Results For Election 2022

Board Trustee by the people of Manitoulin by a margin of 212 votes over incumbent Margaret Stringer.

There were acclamations for the three boards: Espanola's Bob Clement for the Rainbow District board. Rachelle Beaubien for the French public-school board, and Paul Gervais for the French Catholic board.

TOWN OF ESPANOLA

CERTIFIED RESULTS: Doug Gervias is the new mayor of Espanola winning by a large margin over his nearest opponent, Dennis Lendrum. Gervais took in 1,030 votes to Lendrum's 312. Former councillor Maureen Van Alstine acquired 203 votes followed by a former mayor Ron Piche with 139.

The new councillors are Angela Kelly, 1,293, Aidan Kallioinen, 1,023, John Nadeau, 1,009, Sandra Hayden (incumbent) 699, Gerry Massicotte, 673 and Ken Duplessis (incumbent) 614.

TOWNSHIP OF BALDWIN **RESULTS:** Mayor Vern Gorman is acclaimed.

The successful candidates for council are: Jason Cote, 139, Gerald Lepine, 128,

Ray Maltais, 124 and Bert McDowell, 114.

NAIRN & **HYMAN TOWNSHIP**

RESULTS: Amy Mazey is Nairn & Hyman's new mayor with 152 votes to Seppo Vataja's 46.

The new councillors are Wayne Austin, 104, Guy Despatie, 100, Rod MacDonald, 89 and Trevor McVey with 129 votes.

SABLES-SPANISH RIVERS **TOWNSHIP**



OPP Canines Take A 'Paws' Fighting Crime To Strike A Pose Calendar Proceeds Support Charities



(ORILLIA, ON) - The Ontario Provincial August's model, seven-year-old Dance Police (OPP) canines put their best paws forward in the seventh annual OPP Canine Unit Calendar, with proceeds going to support charities.

The OPP Canine Unit has been supporting frontline and specialized policing functions to keep Ontarians safe for more than 50 years. Handlers and their canines provide assistance with search and rescue, tracking wanted persons, detecting narcotics, and searching for firearms, explosives and physical evidence.

canines from around the province showcasing their specialty, location and role. July's canine, six-year-old Kilo from London, is seen being lifted onto his handler's shoulder using the carry method - a move that allows canines to be comfortably carried over dangerous grounds. In March you will meet fiveyear-old Mane from Orillia, an explosives detection canine who uses his keen sense of smell to identify an explosive device under a vehicle during a training exercise. Finally, prepare to get on the water with

Training Teachers To Support Students In **Pursuing A Career In A Skilled Trade**

On Thursday, October 27, some 30 grade 7 and 8 and cooperative education teachers, as well as guidance counselors from various Conseil scolaire catholique Nouvelon schools met at the Sudbury campus of Collège Boréal to take part in a training session entitled "A Choice to Learn about Skilled Trades."

During this session, offered jointly by Collège Boréal and CSC Nouvelon, participants were informed about future employment opportunities, transferable skills, multiple post-secondary pathways and specialized high school programs COOP/OYAP, (SHSM. DCP and APE). Following a guided tour of Collège Boréal workshops, participants will live an experiential learning activity in two trades of their choice. either in electricity, carpentry, architecture or plumbing. Led by professors from these programs, these interactive workshops allowed participants to learn about the value of skilled trades. Subsequently, information sessions on the apprenticeship path and the college path as options for a career in the skilled trades will be led by experts at Collège Boréal.

Through this joint activity, Collège Boréal and CSC Nouvelon wish to inform students of the importance of skilled trades and career choices as well as possible postsecondary training options to access them.

"The Conseil scolaire catholique Nouvelon seeks to meet the needs of the labour market as it deals with labour shortage in several skilled trades. Our students are encouraged to consider careers that are in high demand and supported them in this professional transition through the specialized programs such as cooperative education, the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program, the Major High Skills Major and Dual Credit courses. We want to support our students by offering them the knowledge, experience and required transferable skills to guide them towards a great future career. »


