Cambrian Celebrates Partners And Remembers Founding Co-ordinator Of Health Science Programs



Moving to Sudbury to accept the position of chief technologist at Sudbury Memorial Hospital, Russell initiated the Sudbury School of Radiography where he was chief instructor until 1969.

He was appointed to the position of technical director of the Northern School of Radiography and subsequently was chairman of the Northern Ontario Health Science Schools which incorporated nursing, medical lab technologist and radiography programs.

Continuing his interest in education he was appointed co-ordinator of Health Science programs at Cambrian College. Russell, a resident of Espanola and Manitoulin Island in his twilight years, passed away on September 14th at the age of 88. The evening also included special plaques presented to various supporters, including Domtar and the nominees for the

upcoming Premier Awards.

Over 100 members of the Cambrian College community gathered in celebration of innovation and the incredible impact achieved by their generous donors and partners each year.

Chi-Cheemaun's 2022 Sailing Season Ends



The Chi-Cheemaun had its final run Sunday, October 16th.

The ferry departed for Tobermory and arrived at her winter berth in Owen Sound Harbour later in the day.

Owen Sound Transportation says their final traffic numbers fared better than expected given this being their first season operating without COVID-19 capacity restrictions since 2019. According to the release, the ferry carried 21 per cent more vehicles

and 31 per cent more passengers over the 2021 sailing season, for a total of 57,320 vehicles and 154,312 passengers.

It was also noted there were 28 cancelled trips, ten due to weather and 18 due to mechanical issues.

The Chi-Cheemaun provides vehicle and passenger ferry service between the ports of Tobermory on the Bruce Peninsula and South Baymouth, Manitoulin Island.
