## **GARBAGE AND RECYCLING**

# RESIDENTS MUST PLACE THEIR GARBAGE AND RECYCLING AT THE ROAD EDGE ROAD EDGE IS DEFINED AS

#### 1. Residents with Roads that have cement curb and gutter:

The placement of garbage and recycling shall be at the edge of curb.

#### 2. Residents with a sidewalk in front:

The placement of garbage and recycling shall be placed on the street side of the sidewalk.

#### 3. Street with paved shoulders

The placement of garbage and recycling shall be in the low spot of the paved shoulder near the vehicular travelled path.

#### 4. Streets with Gravel shoulders

The placement of garbage and recyclables is within 3 to 5 feet or 1m to 1.6m of pavement edge.



### 5. Residents on the Highway

The placement of garbage and recycling should be within the 3 to 5 feet or 1m to 1.6 mm from where the shoulder meets the ditch.

#### **Elections Canada Has No Status With Boundary Change Proposals**

Northern Ontario's Chambers of Commerce have sent a letter to Elections Canada pointing out their concerns about possibly eliminating a Northern Ontario riding, but a spokesperson says Elections Canada has no status when it comes to proposed boundary changes.

Matthew McKenna of Elections Canada acknowledges the chambers penned a letter to the Chief Electoral Officer of Canada regarding the new electoral boundaries proposed by the independent Federal Electoral Boundaries Commission for Ontario but says Elections Canada has no say in how the boundaries are drawn.

He adds those decisions are made exclusively by the independent commissions set up in each province.

McKenna adds it is the Commission's role, and not Elections Canada's to consider the input received from Canadians and members of the House of Commons when determining the boundaries.

The Commission has recommended the Algoma-Manitoulin-Kapuskasing riding be eliminated and divided between the Sault and Nickel Belt ridings.

#### **MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS – FAQ'S**

The 2022 municipal elections will be utilizing internet and telephone

#### What is electronic voting?

Electronic voting consists in casting a vote by electronic means as opposed to traditional voting process such as voting in person on paper and voting by mail.

#### Where can you cast an electronic vote from?

Electronic votes can be cast through the following channels:

- On any device with an Internet connection (computer, smartphone, tablet, etc.).
- From a phone, by listening to the instructions and using the touchpad.
- In-person, by casting a vote through electronic voting terminals (kiosks) located in polling stations or other voting venues (libraries, etc.).

Note that neither type of electronic voting stores your vote in the device you are voting from. Votes are sent remotely to a central counting server in all cases.

Make sure you have your PIN, which is required to use online voting. Without it you will not be able to vote. You can vote at any time starting from October 11th at 9:00 am to October 24th at 8:00 pm.

- 1) Open an Internet browser.
- 2) Use the link you can find in the letter you received and access the Voter Portal.
- 3) Log into the voting portal with the PIN and your date of birth.4) Once you are logged in, follow the steps to cast your vote.

Note: If your connection is interrupted while voting electronically, you can access again to the voting system to end the voting process.

#### What is my PIN?

The PIN is the piece of information that each voter receives by letter to access the Voter Portal.

This PIN belongs only to you and must be kept private and safe.

#### I have not received my letter. How can I vote?

Before the election, you should have received a letter with your personal voting credentials and instructions on how to vote. If you have not received a letter, contact the Township Office.

#### I lost my PIN. How can I recover it?

If, for any reason, you lost your PIN, come to the Township Office and ask for a new PIN from the Clerk or designate. You must bring identification with you.
