MPP Gélinas Appeals To Human Rights Commissioner As Bill 7 **Passes Vote**

by Rosalind Russell Moving vulnerable seniors into a long-term care facility not of their choosing does not sit well with Nickel Belt MPP, France Gelinas, so she has sent a letter to the Human Rights Commission.

She says that Bill 7, which could force the elderly now receiving alternative accommodations in hospital would be forced into a long-term home not of their choosing.

She says most alternate level of care patients in hospitals are not waiting for a long-term care bed, but rather home

Gelinas adds several other groups including the Advocacy Centre for the Elderly, Canadian Union of Public Employees and the Ontario Health Coalition also wrote to the Ontario

Fonom Waiting For Resolutions Calling On Electoral Boundaries To Remain The Same

The Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities expects to receive several resolutions from the 110 municipalities in Northern Ontario calling for electoral boundaries to remain the same.

FONOM president Danny Whalen says they are aware of one such resolution coming from St. Charles asking for the Federal Electoral Districts Redistribution – Ontario Commission to leave the ridings as they are.

He says the commission is recommending eliminating the Algoma-Manitoulin-

Kapuskasing riding and having it absorbed between Nickel Belt and Sault Ste. Marie.

Whalen says it is not fair for the north to lose more representation in the House of Commons, which could only have a detrimental effect on the North.

He adds St. Charles is expected to submit their resolution soon with other municipalities to follow suit.

The commission has recommended the move following a nearly 25 percent loss of the population in AMK.

Mantha Reintroduces Loverin's Law To Improve Abuse Prevention Education In Ontario

Last Tuesday, Michael Mantha, NDPMPP for Algoma-Manitoulin, reintroduced an Act to proclaim Abuse Prevention Week and to establish an Abuse Prevention Framework Advisory Committee which would proclaim the week beginning on the first Sunday in October of each year as Abuse Prevention Week.

Mantha says he is proud of the proposed Loverin's Law, legislation that would ensure youth have the tools and supports to stop the circle of abuse and violence.

He adds during Abuse Prevention Week, all Ontario schools would teach an evidence-based curriculum focused on abuse prevention, which it does not provide at this time.

Mantha reintroduced the legislation yesterday afternoon as the fall session of Queen's Park gets underway.

Update on Coronavirus Mandate And Vaccination

Coronavirus isolation mandate ends Ontario's chief medical officer of health says people who come down with COVID-19 no longer need to isolate for five days before returning to work or school.

Doctor Kieran Moore says, instead, they should stay home until their symptoms have eased and they should wear a face mask for ten days.

Moore says he doesn't expect a return to restrictions, saying our high vaccination rates should head off any explosion in the number of cases this fall.

But he adds that, if infection numbers grow too quickly, he may impose a mask mandate.

Moore also says parents of children aged 5 to 11 can start booking COVID-19 booster shots today.

Jump Day Welcomes Around 100 New Students

Espanola High School's new principal is pleased to see some 100 new students welcomed to the facility at Jump Day 2022.

Melanie Bertrand says it was a pleasure to welcome the students and their families yesterday at the annual event. She adds she is excited to become an active member of the school and wider community. Following the assembly, students toured the school, found their homerooms, met their teachers and received their timetables.

hearings on the bill insisting it's needed to quell the provinces current healthcare crisis that has seen many emergency departments and hospital units shut down for hours or days at a time.

The closures have been blamed on staffing shortages.

We ask that when you re-open the main water valve in your home following swabbing, that you turn on a cold water tap without a screen (laundry tub if possible) and let it run to flush any residue that may be left in your water service.

Residents not in the swabbing area <u>could</u> experience dirty water. If you experience dirty water, let your cold water run and it should clear up. If dirty water persists, please call 705-869-1751 between 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.
