According to the release, Sagamok along with the First Nations of Atikameksheng Anishnawbek, and Wahnapitae inked the deal with the Lively-based mining company, which will provide mine contracting services and participation in the economic benefits in their territorial lands

Angus Toulouse, the Chief of Sagamok says his First Nation has always had stewardship responsibilities to the lands and resources and in more recent times, has experienced more positive relationships in the Sudbury mining sector.


