#### **Milestone In Our History**

By Rosalind Russell - Milestone ... it was a sad day for Espanola Thursday, November 30th, we would be remiss if we did not acknowledge the idling of the Domtar Pulp and Paper Mill in Espanola... In a short history of our town, it is ironic that Espanola was founded in 1899 as a company-owned town. That year, the Ontario government signed the Espanola Agreement with the Spanish River Pulp and Paper Company, which gave the company the authority to begin logging operations over a 5,600 km area for the next 21 years.

Under the agreement, a pulp mill capable of employing 250 people was to be constructed. A company-owned town site was established which stretched from the Spanish River to where Second Street is today.

It is not the first time the mill has been shut down. Following World War I, an improved economy resulted in the expansion of the paper mill and an influx of new people. Two new schools and a community center were built.

#### Milestone In Our History

The mill now employed almost 700 people. Unfortunately, this economic boom was short-lived and by 1924 the pulp and paper industry had become somewhat depressed, resulting in a number of people leaving town. In 1928 the Abitibi Power and Paper Company merged with the Spanish River Pulp and Paper Mills Company. Abitibi had overextended its finances and was forced to begin laying off employees.

On December 31, 1929, the Espanola mill was closed permanently. A small maintenance crew was kept on to provide public utility services to the town site.

During World War II, Espanola became the site of a prisoner-of-war camp for German soldiers.

In 1943, the Kalamazoo Vegetable Parchment Company of Michigan purchased both the mill and the company's town site and restarted

the mill operations. A Canadian subsidiary company, the KVP Company, was formed to handle the Espanola mill operations. By the mid-1940s, both the mill and the town were in need of modernization and repairs. In 1946 the KVP Company established the Espanola Development Company as a whollyowned, privately incorporated subsidiary to administer the town.

On March 1, 1958, Espanola was incorporated as a Town with a population of 5000. Since its inception as a municipality, Espanola has continued to expand. The pulp and paper mill was under the ownership of E.B. Eddy since 1969, and then Domtar Incorporated.

It was purchased by Paper Excellence in November 2021, but the new owners have chosen to divest themselves of the property leading to the idling of the mill.

### Espanola Regional Hospital & Health Centre Ask For **Funding Supports For Recruitment**

The Espanola Regional Hospital & Health a position to help strengthen their partnership Centre is asking Espanola council for support in recruiting.

CEO Jane Battistelli, and Primary Care Manager, Jon Brunetti, met with council last Tuesday night to present "the successes and the pressures" on the local health care

They are also looking for a contribution of \$30,000, \$20,000 more than last year, from the town for physician and clinic recruitment. To that end, the hospital complex has created with Northern Ontario School of Medicine University in hopes of enhancing recruitment and retention of family physicians.

Officials say the two-year pilot position is where a physician is developing aprogram to help staff deal with complex cases faced in the rural emergency department and acute care setting.

Council will now review the information submitted by the pair and will decide on support at a later council meeting.

### **Espanola Continuing With Waste Reduction Program**

With support from Impact Canada's Food Waste Reduction Challenge, a pilot program was run in the Town of Espanola that included 100 participating households and has achieved measurable success.

That's accoring to Farah Sheriffdeen and Brittany Clarke, the municipal partner coordinators who told council the Food Recycler Pilot Project was a successful one. Sheriffdeen says the town paid out the initial \$10,000 with residents paying a small fee to purchase the portable systems, and usage was tracked for 12 weeks to calculate total waste diversion.

Clarke says they received 70 responses out of the 100 participants as part of a survey adding 29.7 metric tons of waste is estimated to have been diverted from the local landfill this year.

She adds the unit produces fine compost, which the users can use in their gardens and flower beds.

Council was impressed with the results and have chosen to continue the program looking to expand it across the community.

Interested residents can register their intent to purchase a unit, they will be shipped, with the programming continuing in 2024.



#### Maamwesying And North Shore Health Network Sign Collaboration Agreement

A collaboration was been signed last week between two North Shore health networks. In a gathering held at the Mississauga Community Hall Tuesday, on the Maamwesving North Shore Community Health Services, a core partner of the Maamwesying Ontario Health Team and North Shore Health Network signed a collaboration agreement, sealing their commitment to deliver healthcare for Indigenous peoples in Northeastern Ontario.

The Maamwesying Ontario Health Team was announced in October of 2022 to seamlessly integrate health care services for clients in First Nations across the Northeast, as well as the urban Indigenous population in Sault Ste. Marie.

The collaboration aims to improve access to quality care, enhance satisfaction, foster equitable and culturally safe care, and promote the efficient use of healthcare resources and

will involve health leaders in the planning, design, delivery, and evaluation of health services in both First Nation and non-Native communities.

Carol Eshkakogan, CEO of Maamwesying North Shore Community Health Services Inc./Chair of the Maamwesying Ontario Health Team Leadership Council. stated, "This agreement reaffirms the value of Indigenous peoples and their right to selfdetermination within the healthcare system. Together, we recognize the collective long-term goal of creating a healthcare system free from racism and discrimination" Tim Vine, President, and CEO of North Shore Health Network, remarked, "This collaboration sets a positive precedent for the future of healthcare in Indigenous communities. It focuses on ensuring that care is culturally sensitive, patientcentered, and equitable.
