Adam Page, the Unit's Search Coordinator, says their Ice Rescue Team has been active over the last four years, and the training ensures they can assist with rescues in isolated locations during the winter months.

Page adds in recent years, the members have raised funds to enhance their service with additional navigation equipment, marine equipment and updated vehicles, which helped them expand their abilities to respond to emergency situations.


