Mock Code Orange Tabletop Exercise Carried Out At Espanola Hospital

By *Rosalind Russell* - Staff at Espanola Regional Hospital & Health Centre was tested for their skills in dealing with emergency codes last week. On Thursday, January 19th, staff were joined by Espanola Fire, OPP, EMS and a member of the Patient & Family Advisory Council to work through a tabletop Mock Code Orange involving a school bus and 30 students on board dealing with heavy snow, icy road conditions and a power outage. There was also a power outage (related to the snowstorm), so an additional code was tested (Code Grey – infrastructure loss).

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Concerning Proposed Zoning Bylaw Amendment

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting on Wednesday, February 22, 2023 at 6:30 pm, in Council Chambers, in order to consider a proposed application for an amendment to the Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw 2020-41 under Section 34 of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended.

File No. ZBA23-01 Purpose and Effect: The amendment, once approved, would allow for a Semi-Detached Dwelling in the Commercial Zone. The property subject to this amendment application is described as 195 Sable Street, Salter Township, Section 25, Unit 9, D265. The land subject of this application is not subject of any other Planning Act application.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers on the proposed zoning by-law amendment, you must make a written request to the Township.

ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting and/or make written or verbal representation either in support of, or in opposition to, the proposed By-law Amendment.

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township before the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submissions to the Township before the proposed By law Amendment is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION related to the proposed amendments is available at the municipal office at 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey during regular office hours.

Mock Code Orange Tabletop Exercise Carried Out At Espanola Hospital

According to the release, the facilities use several emergency codes to ensure the safety of staff, patients and visitors involving a coordinated response to emergencies with both staff and community partners.

The Mock Code Orange is in response to mass casualties or what is called a CBRNE - chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear or explosives disaster.

The exercise was considered a success.

Espanola Regional Hospital & Health Centre has several emergency codes in place to ensure the safety of patients, families and visitors. These codes support a coordinated response to emergencies by employees, medical staff and volunteers. These mock codes allow the organization to test emergency processes and make certain they are prepared to react to emergencies that impact our health campus, as well as our community.

A Code Orange would be called and responded to when there are mass casualties or a CBRNE (chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, explosives) disaster,

whereby the hospital would be receiving multiple casualties and providing emergency care to those affected by the disaster.

A Code Orange would:

- Shift resources internally so ERHHC would be able to receive and treat multiple victims requiring emergency care.
 - Ensure triage and treatment areas are in place to maintain the safety of incoming patients and staff.
 - Activate an Emergency Operations Centre to assist in meeting the increased resource demands and designate an Incident Command as a central location to receive important information (internal and external) and ensuring information is shared appropriately.
 - Establish a Family Information Support Centre that supports the families of victims and ensures information is flowed to them.
- At the end of the day, the mock scenario was considered a success and the work continues to ensure the safety and well-being of staff, patients and partners alike.

Espanola Mayor/Staff Takes In ROMA Conference



Espanola Mayor Douglas Gervais joined more than 1,200 participants from across the province at the 2023 Rural Ontario Municipal Association Conference held last week in Toronto.

In response to the housing crisis, the Government of Ontario has made swift and significant changes that have an impact on land-use planning, public infrastructure financing, environmental protection, and municipal governance.

The conference theme, *Breaking New Ground*, focused broadly on ROMA's advocacy work completed

over the past year, including ROMA's action plan: Opportunities for Rural Ontario in a Post-COVID World. Additionally,

ROMA's Attainable Housing Task Force published an in-depth report in 2022 featuring practical steps to address Ontario's rural housing crisis. Key presenters for the 2023 conference included Ontario Premier Doug Ford, opposition leaders, and provincial and federal ministers.

Keynote speakers included Jesse Wentz, broadcaster and Indigenous advocate, speaking about the current

state of truth and reconciliation in Canada and what can be done to further the process, and award-winning author Dr. Thomas Homer-Dixon, who discussed why our planet is in crisis, and the powers we possess to renew our imperiled world.

Rural Ontario Municipalities Association Chair Robin Jones and Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) President Colin Best also spoke.

Mayor Gervais was joined at the conference by Deputy Mayor Angela Kelly, Councillor Aidan Kallioinen and CAO/Treasurer, Allan Hewitt.

The conference features a vast array of workshops that the group has divvied up to maximize opportunities for gathering information and learning from sector experts. ROMA takes pride in promoting, supporting and enhancing strong and effective rural governments. About 270 of Ontario's 444 municipalities have populations of less than 10,000, while many more are rural in character. The rural arm of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario, ROMA advocates for policies and programs that will help build thriving rural Ontario communities.
