The unit has partnered with the Black Creek Sno-Shoe Trails


organization to host a variety of onsite training, one of which was carried out on the evening of Tuesday, July 11th.

NSSR search coordinator Adam Page says members of their unit from Sudbury and Manitoulin Island came to Espanola to take part, which included track crawling and grid searches.

He says track crawling is where members fan out off trail, about three feet apart and carry out a search, while grid searches are squared off over a wide area and mark them off once completed.


Page says all the members are equipped with GPS monitors and the searches are all recorded on a portable computer system as

they are carried out in real time. He adds they appreciate the access to the trails to be able to help with the ongoing training and looks forward to similar scenarios in the future.
