Espanola Council Invites OPP To Discuss Two Local Police Facilities – Possible New Build?

By Rosalind Russell - Espanola council wants to discuss options for the two existing facilities the Manitoulin OPP use and plans for possible renovations or replacements.

Town Clerk Joseph Burke says council extended an invitation to Infrastructure Ontario and the OPP to provide presentations on options for building one new detachment to replace the two existing facilities, the main detachment on Highway 17 in McKerrow and the municipally-owned building on Highway Six – Centre Street.

He says the invitation came about following a presentation to council in February where Manitoulin Detachment Commander Megan Moriarty explained

Starting in 2024, Ontario students entering Grade 9 must complete a technical education credit to get their high school diploma.

Education minister Stephen Lecce says technical education credits cover everything from construction and transportation to manufacturing to computer technology to hospitality and communication.

He says the province is making the change to expose younger students to technology and the skilled trades, to address Ontario's growing skilled trades shortage.

Lecce adds by requiring

students to take at least one technological education credit in high school, they are opening up doors and creating new pathways to good jobs in STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) and the skilled trades.

He also noted that more than 100,000 skilled trades jobs are unfilled in Ontario, so it is critical to begin the process of filling those jobs in the future. Lecce noted more than 70 per cent of workers in skilled trades-related occupations are men, so the province is also hopeful of attracting more women to those jobs as well.

Treasurer Alan Hewitt told council the 2022 report included the salaries and training expenditures for both the former council's final year in their term, and the new council elected last October.

He adds the report also included remuneration for councillors who sat on the Manitoulin-Sudbury Social Services Board.



Climbing The Mountain ... On A Snow Machine

Elliot Lake council has endorsed an agreement with Mount Dufour to host a hill climb competition on April 1st.

City manager of economic development Steve Antunes asked council for its approval since it will allow the Mount Dufour Ski Area the right to extend its insured licence area to cover the entire facility.

Antunes says the event will bring in participants from across Ontario to climb Mount Dufour on snowmobiles in a race against the clock, but it has been nearly two decades since the event was held in Elliot lake.

Antunes adds the event would generate additional revenue at the end of the season and attract tourists to the community.

He adds the club has also purchased a \$5-million special event policy which has the city named as an additional insured.

Gagnon says the event has been

losing money for many years and recommended that council cancel this year's event in the hopes a third party will come forward.

With the cancellation, he adds the city will save the \$35,000 budgeted for the event.

It was pointed out by various councillors that they do not want to lose the event and hopes a third party steps up to organize it for 2024.




