The ribbon cutting was hosted by Gimaa Angus Toulouse, APS Police Chief Jeff Skye, APS Inspector Mark LeSage, Detachment Commander Vern Macumber, and the member officers.

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Concerning Applications for Consent

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting to consider the proposed applications for Consent under Section 53 of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended. The public meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 28, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. in Council Chambers, at 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey, Ontario.

Consent File No. C-23-03: C-23-04 Purpose and Effect: To provide for the creation of two new lots within the Residential zone. The property is described as Hallam Township, Concession 6, Plan M5, Units 4, 5 and 6, Bolton St, Webbwood. The land in subject application is not subject to any other Planning Act application.

<u>Consent File No. C-23-05</u> Purpose and Effect: To provide for the creation of a new lot within the Rural zone. The property is described as Hallam Township, Concession 5, Lot 10, Parcel 6560, Birch Lake Rd, Massey. The land in subject application is not subject to any other Planning Act application.

Consent File No. C-23-06 Purpose and Effect: To provide for a lot addition within the Rural zone. The property is described as Shakespeare Township, Concession 2, Lot 7, Plan 53R9984, Parcel 28050, Parts 6 & 7, Concession Rd, Webbwood. The land in subject application is not subject to any other Planning Act application.

TAKE NOTICE that if you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers on the proposed application, you must make a written request to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers. To appeal the decision to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal, send an appeal form to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers outlining the reasons for the appeal. You must enclose the applicable appeal fee for each application appealed, paid by cheque, made payable to the Ontario Minister of Finance.

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at the public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the bylaw is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at the public meeting, or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the decision is made, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Tribunal, unless in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

WATER RESTRICTION ADVISORY

Massey residents who draw their water from the municipal water supply are being advised of a water restriction due to maintenance work to our water storage tower.

From June 7-16, 2023, our water storage tower will be off-line and will remain empty. This means that all water that is being used by the public is being treated and pumped directly into the water line distribution system as it is consumed. THERE IS NO BACKUP WATER SUPPLY IN THE TOWER DURING THIS TIME. A slight drop in water pressure may also be noticed.

Residents may only use the water necessary within the household for this time period; no outdoor use of water shall occur.

Cyber Incident At Northern Ontario School Of Medicine University

The Northern Ontario School of Medicine University is recovering from what it calls a "cyber incident".

The post-secondary school says the incident was detected on Wednesday (May 17) and campus internet in Sudbury and Thunder Bay, shared and department drives, many university websites and services continue to be inaccessible.


