By Rosalind Russell - An Espanola man was one of the hundreds who returned home to take part in Remembrance Day Ceremonies held Saturday, November 11th.

For the first time, Thirty-eightyear-old Sergeant Richard Gaudreau of the 436 Squadron Trenton laid a wreath at the Espanola Cenotaph last weekend on behalf of his country.

His mother, Cynthia, says she is proud of her son who has served the last 15 years including deployments in Kuwait, Kandahar and Australia, and involvement in Operation Impact, among many other military exercises around the world.

Born and raised in Espanola, and a graduate of Cambrian College, and Avionics in the military, he was proud and moved to be given the honour of laying the wreath in remembrance of his fellow serving military around the world.

Married to Jacqueline, and with one son, Jack, he returned to active service following the ceremony and the reunion with his Espanola family and friends.

Livestock Protection Dogs

Sables-Spanish Rivers Township has deferred a request from the Manitoulin/ North-Shore Federation of Agriculture to amend the animal control bylaw for the protection of dogs that are used to protect livestock.

The agency is asking the bylaw be amended to protect livestock protection dogs but that does not mean they get to run at large but rather be a deterrent against predators.

Charlie Smith, a local farmer, and director with the federation told council they

believe the dogs should be registered as guardians to protect them when they are at work utilizing the animal registration system should be owned by registered farmers.

He says training is vital but there must be more discussion how to mark them as protection dogs should be put in place as a requirement.

To that end, council deferred the amendment until they hold further discussions and get input from their local animal control bylaw officer.

Sables-Spanish Rivers Township Supports Regional Medical Van

Sables-Spanish Township council has approved the purchase of a regional medical van as a partner within the LaCloche Mayors and Reeves Association.

Espanola Town Clerk Joseph Burke and Mayor Doug Gervais met with council last Wednesday evening to highlight the purchase of a regional medical van to provide transportation for seniors and special needs without transportation to be able to get to medical appointments.

Council supported initiative and will have to pay

Rivers a share based on population for the project.

> Burke says the considerations for approval will take place at Baldwin, Nairn & Hyman, Espanola's respective council meetings.

> He says pending all approvals, the vehicle will be ordered with hope of launching the service in June 2024.

> Burke adds formal announcement regarding the provincial and federal funding in support of the project will be forthcoming as the municipalities get closer to the official launch.


