For Helping Hands Food Bank

Espanola council has referred providing rent support to the Helping Hands Food Bank to the Corporate Services Committee for review following a presentation.

Food bank spokesperson Grant Lewis detailed the programs various and services offered by the food bank, including supporting individuals and families in the wider area and assisting other food banks in the North Shore Corridor.

Lewis says there is also a call-in service available, and taxi delivery for those who are unable to attend the food bank.

He adds the average costs for food per month is over the \$13,000 mark.

Lewis asked council to consider paying the rent for the food bank, which is \$1,500 per month and to add it to the municipal budget as an annual cost.

Council thanked him for the presentation and the ask will now go to the Corporate Services Committee review.

MPP Michael Mantha Moving Bill To Fix Northern Health Travel Grant

ESPANOLA – Michael Mantha, MPP for Algoma-Manitoulin, was joined by Donna Stewart (CAO of the Manitoulin-Sudbury District Services Board) to call on the government of Ontario to pass Bill 13, The Northern Health Travel Grant Advisory Committee Act. The Northern Health Travel Grant (NHTG) is a program administered by the government of Ontario meant to assist patients living in Northern Ontario who need to travel more than 100 km for medical treatment. "Northerners living in rural and remote communities deserve the same access to healthcare as everyone else in Ontario." Said Mantha. "But with the high costs of gas, food and accommodations I am hearing from more and more people who are being financially burdened when they need to travel for treatment." MPP Mantha's legislation, if passed, would establish a committee composed of Northern healthcare providers and residents who will consult with relevant community partners (including primary providers, Indigenous health organizations, Northern public health units, etc.). The bill requires the committee

to study the program's effectiveness and make recommendations to the Minister of Health for improvements. "Being able to get the treatment you need without financial barriers is at the core of our healthcare system in Canada." Said Mantha. "I am calling on the Ford government to do the right thing, listen to people in the North and pass my bill next week." Bill 13 will be debated at second reading in the Legislative Assembly of Ontario on this week, February 22nd, 2024.

Donna Stewart (CAO, Manitoulin-Sudbury District Services Board) - "An increase to Northern Health Travel Grant rates would be extremely helpful for anyone in Northern Ontario and more specifically social assistance recipients. They may not access to important medical care due to the financial burden placed on them through the current system, individuals in the rural north deserve the same access to care as individuals in other parts of the province. A review of the Northern Health Travel Grant system could "result in increased access to important health care."

Nature Conservancy Of Canada Purchases 750 Hectares Of Land On Manitoulin Island

Three large parcels of land on Manitoulin Island have been bought by the Nature Conservancy of Canada to keep the land in a natural wilderness state for

conservation purposes.

According to the release, the conservancy says they have purchased three areas consisting of forest, wetland and alvar sites for conservation on the south shore of the Island.

The three purchases combine for 750 hectares, which are kept in their natural state for environmental research, ecosystem restoration, Indigenous conservation and to protect wildlife in their natural habitat.

The total land base on the Island now protected by the agency is approximately 15,000 hectares.
