

# **New Youth Wellness Hub for** Sagamok-Anishinabek First Nation

The Ontario government is launching a new Youth Wellness Hub to serve Sagamok Anishnawbek First Nation and surrounding

Chief Angus Toulouse says the new hub is one of the eight the government is adding to the 14 already created since 2020.

He says the Hub will be permanently housing its services at its Youth Wellness Centre in 2024 adding it will achieve the community's vision of creating a culturally safe space that places youth and their families at the center of services to address their needs.

The eight new Youth Wellness Hubs funded by the Addictions Recovery Fund are in Sagamok, the Algoma Region, and Sudbury with the other five located in southern Ontario.



# **Treaty Legalities Moving Forward**

It's another step forward for the Robinson-Huron Treaty settlement agreement.

The \$10 billion proposed settlement – involving 21 First Nations including Serpent River, Sagamok, Mississauga and those on Manitoulin Island – was reached with the provincial and federal governments last June.

Trustees with the Robinson Huron Treaty Litigation Fund met last week and signed the agreement.

It now goes to Ontario's Minister of Indigenous Affairs to be signed, then to the federal Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations.

This after, officials say, the governments of Canada and Ontario completed their internal approval processes.


