Province Cancels Plans To Haul Radioactive Waste To Baldwin And Nairn



By Rosalind Russell - Nairn & Hyman CAO and Clerk Belinda Ketchabaw says plans to haul radioactive waste on Highway 17 from Nipissing First Nation to the townships of Baldwin, and Nairn & Hyman have been cancelled.

Ketchabaw says the niobium will be sent to a facility near Sarnia, where some of the waste was already being transferred. The original plan was for the radioactive material to be transported to the abandoned Lake Agnew Tailings Site, but Ketchabaw says the move sparked public meetings with citizens expressing opposition.

She says there was also concern the site was already leaching toxic minerals into the lake, the source of drinking water for the townships, and the government has stated it will do remedial work on the site.

Major Development In South End Of Espanola – Vacant Rural Land Redesignated As Rural

By Rosalind Russell - The that will see around 16 hectares Town of Espanola is expanding its footprint for development in the south end of town. that will see around 16 hectares of rural land redesignated for residential use including single-family units, duplexes,

Espanola council met last week to discuss two motions to expand residential land by rezoning from rural to residential allowing for new builds over the next 25 years.

Engineers J L Richards completed a major study of the land located between the Espanola Regional Hospital and Health Centre on McKinnon Drive and the Queensway Avenue as part of the Espanola Official Plan Boundary Expansion project. Council approved the motions

that will see around 16 hectares of rural land redesignated for residential use including single-family units, duplexes, town or row housing and possible apartment buildings. It was pointed out that the population of Espanola is

population of Espanola is expected to expand to over 6,500 people by 2051 with an associated household increase of over 3,500 residences.

The first part of the plan is to see 100 new homes built by 2028.

Council pointed out that residents will be kept informed of the development proposals as they are brought forward.

Manitoulin Island Mourns The Passing Of Premier Artist Ivan Wheale

Wheale, an internationally renowned artist, who has works featured around the world, including Windsor Castle and government buildings in Canada, passed away early Saturday morning. He was in palliative care, having received a cancer diagnosis earlier in the year, but before he passed, he had stated he had no regrets, and had a full life and is especially

proud of leaving a legacy behind to encourage new artists in their endeavors.

Wheale was not only an artist, but he was also a teacher, avid volunteer and the co-founder of the LaCloche Foothills Annual Art Show.

On July 30th, he was presented with two certificates by Algoma-Manitoulin MPP Bill Rosenberg, the first to recognize him for his contributions to the arts from the Province of Ontario and the second acknowledging his nomination for a Queen Elizabeth II Ontario Medal for Citizenship.

He followed in the footsteps of the Group of Seven with paintings depicting the beauty of Manitoulin Island and the North Shore of Lake Huron.

Funeral arrangements are being finalized.

He was 90.

Sergeant Mandamin, who began his policing career in 1991, is being recognized for more than three decades of dedicated service to public safety and community well-being in First Nations communities.

He will be presented with the award during the Anishinabek Evening of Excellence on August 29th in Rama, Ontario with both Wikwemikong Police Chief Ron Gignac and Inspector Tammy Duffy in attendance.

Now in his 34th year of service, Sergeant Mandamin

- commands a platoon of on officers and is known for his ty leadership, mentorship and gt. operational excellence.

His work has included RIDE checks, emergency response, search warrant execution and patrol duties, often during the overnight hours.

He has also worked as an expert criminal investigator on the crime unit.

In July 2024, Sgt. Mandamin and Const. DiSalvo were credited with saving a family from a burning residence, risking their own lives in the process, an act that highlighted Sgt.

Mandamin's bravery and commitment to his community. He is also recognized for his role as a mentor to new Indigenous police recruits. His efforts have helped train and guide future officers with a focus on integrity, respect and service.
