Nairn Councillor Resigns Following Failure To Have Reconsideration Of Ic Findings

By Rosalind Russell - A Nairn & Hyman Township councillor has resigned after failing to have a motion for reconsideration of the findings by the Integrity Commissioner to be delayed until May.

The motion was brought by Guy Despatie who had been reprimanded in the commissioner's report that was to be released publicly that evening.

The report looked at several councillors' behaviours from a Nov.18 meeting finding Despatie, Wayne Austin and Rod McDonald had breached sections of the council Code of Conduct.

Mayor Amy Macey says the motion recommended formal censure for all three with a recommendation they all lose renumeration for 30 days.

Despatie then interjected, stating he felt the

commissioner divulging his email to her was a breach and resigned his position as councillor.

Council has now declared the position vacant and a decision on filling the vacancy either by appointment or by-election will be made at the March meeting.

Council motions to impose remuneration penalties on both Austin and McDonald were defeated.

Start2Finish Expands LIT Project To School And Daycare In Sagamok Anishnawbek FN



By Rosalind Russell - A new vending machine offering free, culturally relevant books to students at Sagamok Anishinabek First Nation's elementary school and daycare has been introduced to students.

Officials say Start2Finish Canada is a national charity founded on the belief that every child deserves the tools to succeed, and its mission is to break the cycle of child poverty by providing educational support to at-risk children.

Start2Finish has expanded its Indigenous Literacy Enhancement Project and Sagamok Anishinabek is the first in the area to receive the vending machine with students receiving a token every month, then make their selection and receive their book.

The project was initiated by Colleen Toulouse, Sagamok Education's Student Program Coordinator welcomed Brian Warren, the founder of Start2Finish to the launch last Friday.

He says since the pandemic, literacy gaps have widened even more for children from vulnerable communities, and communityled, culturally responsive interventions are needed to address the gaps and give children the tools they need to succeed.

He adds the school, and daycare will receive 2,000 titles per year over the next three years, all written and created by First Nations' voices.

Sagamok's lead on this project, Colleen Toulouse, shares, "I applied on behalf of Biidaaban Kinoomaagegamik Start2Finish in May 2024.

For me, reading has always been encouraged in my home by my parents.

I still to this day, remember reading The Unjust Society by Harold Cardinal when I was young.

He wrote about the realization of our full potential, and we must be who we are.



For me, reading and writing about ourselves is one way to keep us on the path of reaching our full potential."

The project is being implemented with the support of the Future Generations Foundation.

The expectation is that every student will go home with books or graphic novels of their choice, every month.

Vance McPherson, Director of Education for Sagamok Anishnawbek adds, "We are grateful for this initiative to put high quality literature by Indigenous authors in the hands of our students.

We all know that when we get kids excited about reading, we set them up for a bright future on whatever path they choose to follow.

I think that Start2Finish's approach to supporting literacy is innovative and exciting, and we're all looking forward to hearing from our students and families about the worlds they will visit through these books."
