NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Concerning an Application for Consent

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting to consider the proposed application for Consent under Section 53 of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended. The public meeting will be held on **Wednesday**, **March 26th**, **2025 at 6:30 p.m.** in Council Chambers, at 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey, Ontario.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Consent File No. C-25-002 To provide for a lot addition within the Rural Zone. The property is described as Hallam Township, Concession 4, PT Lot 2, RP 53M1157, Lot 8. The land in subject application is not subject to any other Planning Act application.

IF YOU WISH TO BE NOTIFIED of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers on the proposed consent application you must make a written request to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers.

ANY PERSON may attend the Public Meeting and/or make written or verbal representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed consent application.

TAKE NOTICE THAT only the applicant, a public body that, before the approval authority made its decision, made oral comments at a public meeting or written submissions to the approval authority, a specified person prescribed by the Planning Act, the Minister, or the municipality in which the subject land is located, may appeal this decision.

An appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT) in respect to the proposed consent application may be made by filing a notice of appeal with the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers either via the Ontario Land Tribunal e-file service (first time users will need to register for a My Ontario Account) at http://olt.gov.on.ca/e-file-service by selecting Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers as the Approval Authority or by mail to 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey Ontario POP 1PO. The notice of appeal must set out the reasons for the appeal.

Any person or public body may, not later than 20 days after the giving of notice is completed, appeal the decision or any condition imposed by the council or the Minister or appeal both the decision and any condition to the Tribunal by filing with the clerk of the municipality or the Minister a notice of appeal setting out the reasons for the appeal, accompanied by the fee charged by the Tribunal.

The filing of an appeal after 4pm., in person or electronically will be deemed to have been received the next business day. The appeal fee of \$1,100 can be paid online through e-file or by certified cheque/money order to the Minister of Finance, Province of Ontario. If you wish to appeal to the OLT or request a fee reduction for an appeal, forms are available from the OLT website www.olt.gov.on.ca. If the e-file portal is down, you can submit your appeal to inquiries@sables-spanish.ca.

AND TAKE NOTICE THAT no person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the application for consent was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the council or, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

Town Hall Draws Fair Crowd Focusing On Lack Of **Engagement Concerning Tailings**

By Rosalind Russell - Around 70 people Township, which gets its drinking water attended an open house in Nairn Centre that focused on the disposal of tailings, or leftover waste materials from a mining operation, at a nearby site.

The Township of Nairn & Hyman engaged two scientists to review documentation by various agencies looking into the environmental impact of tailings in the Agnew Lake Tailings site.

According to local officials, the Ministry of Mines designated the Agnew Lake Tailings Management Area to receive niobium tailings from the Nova Beaucage Mine last year, but without consultation with either the municipality or its neighbour, Baldwin

from Agnew Lake.

The LaCloche Foothills municipalities pooled together to commission three independent studies by Hutchinson Environmental Sciences Limited.

The reports were shared at the meeting detailing that the scientists found there were deficiencies in the reports from the ministry and that more research has to be done on the environmental long-term effects of disposing of the NORM.

The project has been halted for the time being, but the municipality says there should be no transporting waste until more answers are forthcoming.

Espanola Receives Federal Funds Towards Housing



By Rosalind Russell - The Town of Espanola is receiving \$2 million from the federal government's Housing Accelerator Fund to assist in the construction of 64 new homes over the next three years by putting an Action Plan in place to assist developers and speed up development.

Nickel Belt MP Marc Serre made the announcement before a small group at the

Espanola Regional Recreation Complex Tuesday, February 26th, noting that small municipalities need financial support to assist in alleviating the housing crisis.

Espanola Mayor Doug Gervais says it's much needed in the wake of the closure of the Domtar Pulp and Paper Mill nearly a year ago and in meeting the municipal Strategic Plan. Town CEO Joseph Burke says the town will be taking a five-prong Action Plan approach in utilizing the funds by diversifying housing density, introducing a Climate Adaptability Plan to support energy-efficient housing, modernizing the geographical information system and land utilization strategy to increase the land base, and working closely with housing providers and developers.

He says the action plan could also help spur the construction of 400 new homes over the next ten years.

Real [Estate] Talk



By Chloe Bichette, Broker of Record/Owner, Claudine Bichette Real Estate - Aging in place (or staying in your home as you get older) has many benefits, especially if your home is fully paid for.

It's familiar and comforting, maintains your connection to family, neighbours and can be costmemories, and effective, ultimately delays the stressful transition of moving.

However, sometimes obstacles of aging in place prove to be too great, and becoming a renter again emerges as the most viable option.

When that happens, it's important to know what your rights and responsibilities are as a tenant. The Residential Tenancy Act (RTA) is very specific about expectations, and updated rules apply if you are moving into a home or apartment that was first occupied after November 15, 2018 (i.e. newer construction rentals).

Among other things, those newer rental properties are not rent-controlled, meaning that a landlord has no limit on the amount he can raise the rent each year. This could lead to hundreds or

thousands of dollars additional rent after the initial lease period. It is important to understand the risk that this may impose, especially on those with fixed incomes.

For rental units that were first occupied

before November 15, 2018, a landlord may only raise the rent by the adjusted amount, which is calculated according to the Consumer Price Index (CPI). In the last few years, that increased amount has been around 2.5%.

Other things to consider when becoming a tenant include: knowing your rights if the property you are renting goes up for sale, an imposition on guest limits, or if you can sublet the property.

You should also keep in mind that it is the landlord's responsibility to maintain the property, and that includes lawn care and snow removal. The landlord cannot request extra payment from you for those services.

Tenants have successfully sued landlords at the Landlord Tenant Board charging extra, or inducing a tenant to sign a contract for landscaping services.

Renting can be a wonderfully care- and worry-free way to live, but if you haven't rented for a while, ensure that you understand the terms of, and sign, a Standard Lease Agreement, which is accessible online on the province's website.

Tender Approved For Phase Four Of Highway Six – Centre Street In Espanola

By Rosalind Russell - The to fund any portion of the tender to complete the construction of Phase Four of Highway Six – Centre Street in Espanola has been approved by council.

Special Projects Manager Joel Yusko says the town received five tenders for the work to rebuild the main byway from Sheppard Street to Tudhope Street.

He says the winning bid is from Green Infrastructure Partners Limited at just over \$6.0 million dollars.

He adds there is a debt to a maximum of \$1,100,000

project that cannot be funded from reserves, adding the total municipal commitment increased from the original estimate by that amount since the project was originally proposed.

Yusko explains the 2024 capital budget committed iust over \$2.5 million dollars from reserves with a total municipal contribution of \$3.6 million dollars.

Council approved the tender with the work expected to begin soon.

LaCloche OPP Detachment Board Established for Espanola/North Shore Corridor

By Rosalind Russell - The seats on the LaCloche OPP Detachment board established for the Espanola and North Shore Corridor late last year have now been filled and policies put in place as they begin their work in 2025.

The board is made up of representatives of all LaCloche four Foothill municipalities including Espanola Mayor Doug Gervais as chair, Merri-Ann Hobbs as vice-chair, and Tim Weatherley, Wayne Austin and Robert Towns.

The executive is rounded out by Joseph Burke as executive assistant with the Town of Espanola agreeing to provide 10 hours of work in that capacity, and the town also agreed to provide payroll and financial reporting.

The four councils: Espanola, Sables-Spanish Rivers, Baldwin and Nairn & Hyman, have also put a renumeration, travel and training package in place for the board members. Their next meeting will be held in late March.
