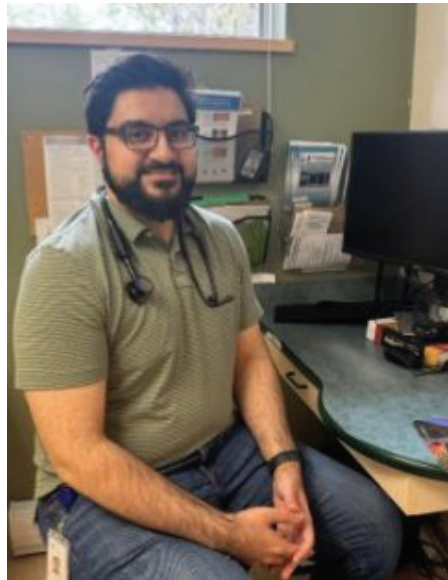

Municipal Elections

Notice of Nomination for Office Municipal Elections Act, 1996 (s.32)



Nominations for the positions listed below must be made on the prescribed form available at your municipal Clerk's Office. Nomination papers must be filed, either in person or by your agent, with the Returning Officer of the appropriate municipality during that office's normal office hours between **May 1, 2026 to Thursday, August 20, 2026**, and between **9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on Friday, August 21, 2026** (Nomination Day).

The required fee for a Member of Council is \$100.00 and the required fee for Head of Council is \$200.00. The required fee shall be in the form of cash, cheque, money order or debit (with the exception of Baldwin) and must accompany the signed forms. A nomination paper must be certified by the Municipal Clerk before such person becomes a candidate for office. A nomination paper must be filed prior to accepting campaign contributions or incurring expenses. You are entitled to be an elector and to run for office if you are not disqualified by any Act or Law and on voting day if you are:

1. a resident of the Town/Township; or,
2. a non-resident who is an owner or tenant of land in the Town/Township or the spouse of or same sex partner of such an owner or tenant; and,
3. a Canadian citizen; and,
4. of the full age of 18 years.

Nomination forms must be filed with the municipality you are seeking office.

As we sat in the tent that night, warm and cozy for the first time in days, we thanked the Lord for His provision. "Tomorrow we should reach Missanabie town and our end point, won't we?" I asked. "Yep, we will, then we'll head for Wawa for the night, before heading back home." He smiled and gave me a hug. This trip had been challenging because of the weather and rough paddling—we would be glad for it to end. "Well in that case for the first time in four days, I'm going to have dry, warm feet, while I paddle." I pointed to the map. "You see there's only one portage left and it's called the 'Height of Land' portage, so it's bound to be high and dry, so I'm going to put on my dry runners and woolly socks." I rubbed my cold feet in

anticipation. It was the standard practice on any wilderness outing to protect your dry, nighttime gear—no matter the cost. On every canoe trip, you always wore water shoes or old runners that you didn't mind getting wet in the canoe—hence your feet were always cold and wet. You guarded your dry shoes and socks—protecting them from moisture so that at least once daily your feet would be dry. So, in my determination to have warm feet for the last cold day of paddling, I was risking my dry shoes. But was it a risk—after-all the end was in sight? Only one portage and a twenty-kilometer paddle across Dog Lake stood between me and a warm shower, yummy food and soft bed. Ahhhhh.

Debut Film Focuses On The Creation Story Of Espanola's Michael "Cy" Cywink



By Rosalind Russell - A debut film focusing on The Creation Story of Espanola's internationally known artist, Michael 'Cy' Cywink' has been released.

Cory Bilyea of EagleEyes Photography & Media Productions says the documentary offers an intimate exploration of Cywink's forty-year journey as a curator, artist and Indigenous teacher.

Bilyea says the film profiling Cywink will premiere this June in Blyth, Ontario and it is free to the public.

He adds reprints of Cywink's book, the Adventures of Crazy Turtle will also be available with Cywink personally signing them at the Blyth

Festival Art Gallery.

The film will feature two primary screenings at Blyth Memorial Hall on the Margaret Stephens Stage: Sunday, June 21, 2026, at 5:00 p.m. and Sunday, June 28, 2026, at 5:00 p.m.

While tickets are free, it is recommended that people book in advance through the Blyth Festival Box Office to secure their spot and ensure smooth entry to the screenings and related events.

Known for his use of colour and "word art", officials say Cywink treats his work as a "living history," focused on breaking down cultural barriers and fostering healing through the mind, body, and spirit. He is the former curator for the Ojibwe Cultural Foundation in M'Chigeeng and an independent curator of exhibits like Aawan-eyaawang.

He also served as a First Nations cultural consultant for Walt Disney Imagineering and the Disney's America theme park project.

Interfor Indefinitely Cutting Operations At Nairn Centre

By Rosalind Russell - Interfor says it will be indefinitely cutting operations at Nairn Centre.

In a release, company vice-president of corporate communication & government relations Svetlana Kayumova says Interfor has made the difficult decision to indefinitely curtail operations at their Nairn Centre facility due to ongoing weak market conditions, sustained softwood lumber duties and tariffs, and continued cost pressures.

She says there is no timeline for a restart at this time.

She adds the operation will continue running for a limited period to process existing log inventory, with the sawmill expected to operate into early to mid June and the planer into late June, subject to confirmation.

Kayumova says the decision was not taken lightly and the company recognizes the impact this has on employees and the broader Nairn community.
